RECORDED CRIME & DISORDER UPDATE

This report sets out the recorded crime figures for April - May 2011/12 compared to the same period in 2010/11. Previous reports also included a breakdown of anti social behaviour codes, however the recording of ASB incidents changed as of 01/04/11 so there will be no comparisons by individual codes for this financial year. Total ASB incidents for April – May 2011/12 have remained constant at 2,858, a 0% change compared to 2010/11.

¹Other theft continues to show an increasing trend due to ongoing issues with metal thefts, and this crime category now accounts for around a third of total crime per month. There are no significant concerns with shoplifting, however theft of bicycles is on the increase. Offences are spread across the Borough and numerous operations / initiatives to tackle Other Theft are in place. Other Theft offences are leading the district hotspots via the T&CG process.

For Vehicle crime offences there are no main areas of concern with offences being sporadic and spread throughout the Borough. Several nominals from the Hardwick area, including a district target have been linked to offending with several arrests made.
