

Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) – Movements between 2004 and 2010

1. The IMD is the Government’s way of measuring variations in deprivation levels across the country.
2. The IMD data for 2010 was published in March 2011 down to Lower Super Output Area level, and Stockton’s position in the overall ranking (compared to other local authority areas) has improved from 75 to 95 in the period since 2004.
3. The current IMD is made up of seven ‘domains’. The table below shows the movement in each domain over the same period.
4. These movements show changes in the performance in Stockton relative to other local authority areas. It is possible for our absolute performance to improve, but for Stockton still to slip down the rankings, if general performance improves even faster than ours. Conversely, it is possible for our absolute performance to deteriorate, but for Stockton still to climb up the rankings, if general performance deteriorates even faster than ours.
