Officers and town centre management have adjusted tours of duty to police the centre to reduce criminal damage and youth disorder. Fines continue to be issued for those cycling on footpaths and youths cycling in the play area of John Whitehead Park.	Vehicles are being driven in an asb manner on Casson Way, all evenings. Patrols are being carried out. There will be continued partnership working with enforcement. Complaints were received regarding drivers on High Grange Avenue, especially at the roundabout near the shops. Offending drivers have been spoken to and warning notices issued.	ASB is occurring in Quenby Road at all times. Patrols have been conducted and officers have engaged with children and parents. Offenders have been arrested and asb forms issued. ASB in Thornaby TC has been reported. There have been reductions in the number of calls from the TC over the past month. Local beat officers continue to monitor the area and regularly in touch with security staff from the main store.	Metal theft in the Swainby Road area remains a priority. The police are working with Tristar homes and the demolition contractor and will be given the area extra attention. ASB in the Albany area is also a priority. Patrols have been increased along the cycle path that links Norton Grange and the Albany Estate. Youths are gathering at the underpass below Norton Road lighting fires. Police have been liaising with the enforcement team and the council to have rubbish and wheelie bins removed before it can be set alight. Joint visits have been made with partner agencies

				to speak to parents of youths causing problems and evidence is being collated.
