Basis of 'matched funding' offer currently unclear, but there may be some extra funding available to support work with problem families, and this may link to the IOM scheme.	
<b>3.</b>	<b>'IOM 2'</b>  LS reported that Jeff Evans and John Ward had been discussing ways of making further progress in respect of a larger number of substantial offenders, especially those with issues in relation to the four 'key criminogenic needs', i.e. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Accommodation</li> <li>▪ Drugs and Alcohol</li> <li>▪ Finances</li> <li>▪ Attitudes</li> </ul> Date to be arranged for a dedicated session on this in early February.
