Revised Community Safety Targets and Action Plans

- 1.1 At the last SSP it was agreed that the community safety targets and action plans for the six themed areas would be reviewed to both ensure that the current targets are the right ones to measure as well as incorporate the recommendations agreed from the Partnership Strategic Assessment.
- 1.2 The majority of targets have remained the same for 2012/13, however, the following amendments have been made:
 - Anti-social Behaviour Target 1.1 has been amended to 'monitor repeat callers over the year' rather than reduce the number of repeat callers. This is to enable the system to be reviewed further to ensure that links between the Police and Council ASB team are robust.
 - Anti-social Behaviour Target 1.3 has been amended 'to reduce ASB across the borough' rather than in the top five wards. This will provide a picture of ASB across the borough with 'hotspot' areas identified during each reporting period for information.
 - Violence Target 3.2 has been amended to monitor 'a reduction in Violence Against the Person within the night time economy' focussing on Stockton Town Centre and Yarm wards as opposed to the top five wards.
 - **Drugs Target 4.2** 'to reduce drug related repeat offending' has been removed as this information will be picked up in the revised target 6.1.
 - **Criminal Damage Target 5.2** 'to reduce criminal damage at street level' has been removed as it was felt that this target was more operational rather than strategic and progress could be covered through the remaining two targets.
 - **Emerging Issues Target 6.1** has been changed to include all offenders on IOM (PPO's, HCC's and DRR's)
 - **Emerging Issues Target 6.2** has been changed to 'research emerging issues throughout the year'
- 1.3 The remaining recommendations from the PSA have been discussed with theme leads and incorporated into the associated action plans and will be reported on during the annual in-depth discussion for each theme.
- 1.4 It is RECOMMENDED that members of the Partnership agree the new targets.
