Safer Stockton Partnership

Survey of Residents

1. In 2012 a postal survey of residents in seven of the 12 North East Local Authorities (Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Tyneside, Northumberland, Sunderland and Stockton-on-Tees) was undertaken. This method is closely comparable with the last national 'Place Survey' organised by CLG in 2008. Results on key community safety issues are summarised below.

- 2. Members of the Partnership will note that the 2012 results are better than the 2008 results in all cases but one (the first issue), on which they were equal.
- 3. The value of these results to the Partnership will be increased when the average results for the other authorities are released. It is understood informally that the Stockton results on community safety issues are the best of any of the seven participant authorities.
