We are asking shops and other Businesses to put a Safe Place sticker in their window.



Anyone who lives in West Sussex and has a learning difficulty can have a Safe Place card.

What Do I Do If I Don't Feel Safe?

If you feel threatened, bullied, have had an accident or are lost, you can go to a shop with the safe Place sticker.



Show a shop assistant your Safe Place card and they will help you.



If you can't find a place with the Safe Place sticker you can call the Police on the national non emergency number **101**



Or in an emergency you can call **999**
