

The chart above illustrates crime rate per 1000 population for Stockton in comparison to the national average. This clearly demonstrates that Stockton is well below the national average for crime with the numbers per year shown in table 1.

The crime rate in Stockton has reduced by 44% over the 8 year period compared to a national reduction of 38%.
