College of Policing (Efficiency and Knowledge Support Unit) Peer Review

Cleveland Police have in place four well developed Integrated Offender Management schemes. Cleveland Police and partner agencies are keen to continually improve and to that end the E&KSU have been commissioned to work with Cleveland Police and the Probation Service and their partners to;

- Support them to establish a methodology for common reoffending measures for the four IOM programmes within the Cleveland area.
- To advise, based on previously identified evidence based practice;
- On the most salient and beneficial types of measure(s) of reoffending within IOM schemes performance management
- Offender selection and de-selection
- Resources

ACC Roberts has commissioned this work on behalf of Cleveland Police.

The E&KSU will conduct a peer review in Cleveland on 14th – 16th May 2013 by way of interviewing staff, holding focus groups and examining relevant paperwork from Police and partners. Peers experienced in IOM will be utilised alongside E&KSU staff. Following the review the E&KSU will provide a de-brief to the Force and their partners including a hot de-brief, a formal report and a formal presentation.

Service Unit managers are requested to make staff available for interview and focus groups and to keep their respective Community Safety Partnerships informed of this review.
