	Police Officers have had access to the E-Learning training programme to provide them with an early introduction to the new powers. Also looking to expand PCSO powers to use the new Community Protection Notice, awaiting feedback on this proposal.	
	The LGA are going to announce some training workshops at the end of November for front line officers to share their experiences of the new powers and to explore any initial issues.	
4.	Probation update	
	No major changes at this point, both NPS and CRC and continuing to work together and managing the respective caseloads. Awaiting the announcement of the preferred bidders which may be at the end of November, although this has not been confirmed.	
	Issue surrounding support funding for MAPPA was raised, currently the NPS fund a full time co-ordinator, no other partner contributes to this post. NSP no longer in a position to fund this post in its entirety after March 2015 and are looking for contributions from others or suggestions of alternative funding streams. It was recommended that the PCC be approach as an option.

	There was a good start to the year in terms of deliberate fires with some good reductions. The warm/dry summer did have an impact on this these figures. Accidental home fires are currently down 50%.
