ACTION PLAN FOR 2014/2015

The Domestic Abuse Strategy identifies a need to focus on Awareness and Education, Early Intervention and Support and Protection. The following actions are all encompassed within these themes. The actions have been segmented into sections relating to Communications and Consultation, Data Collation and Information Sharing, Education and Training and Development of Support Pathways as these were the four key priority areas identified for action during the consultation process undertaken from June to December 2013.
