### SSP Revised Alcohol Strategy for Stockton

10/16

A report was presented to the Partnership detailing tackling alcohol related harm in Stockton-on-Tees.

Both the Safer Stockton Partnership and the Health and Well-being Board have committed to exploring the means to tackling alcohol harm in Stockton-on-Tees.

Within the report, the scale of the problem within the region, in particular within the Borough of Stockton was discussed.

Included within the report were the costs that alcohol had on industry due to reduced productivity, staff absence and the inability to work.

The cost to the public sector was also highlighted due to anti-social behaviour, violence and crime, morbidity and mortality, treatment and care.

The likely causes of the increase in alcohol consumption were discussed, including the affordability, availability, cultural change, information and

knowledge.

Detailed within the report was how the causes of alcohol related harm would be tackled in Stockton by:

- 1- Advocating for and implementing evidence based policy and practice
- 2- Maximising the preventative impact of our local legislative powers

3- Challenging the culture of acceptance of alcohol and associated harm; our alcohol-related attitudes and behaviour

4- Strengthening the role and impact of ill-health prevention

A proposed multi-agency working group is to be established in order to coordinate the development and delivery of their commitments.

It was agreed that Cleveland Fire Brigade join the multi-agency working group, in order that they can share their data for fire related incidents and deaths as a result from alcohol.
