SSP Alcohol related offending 8/16

The partnership received a report on Cleveland Against Violence in Communities (CAVIC).

Meeting quarterly, the violence meeting had a multi-agency representation, covering Hate Crime, Domestic Violence, and identifying hotspots of streets and locations, as well as repeat offenders and victims.

The meeting welcomed new agencies to attend the quarterly meetings.

In addition to Violence meetings, alcohol related violated was also covered with Stockton's Local Alcohol Action Area (LAAA).

The LAAA are also a multi-agency group, meeting every 2 months they work at addressing irresponsible alcohol sales, maximising licensing powers to reduce alcohol harm, promote life skills and resilience in children and young people endeavouring to implement good practise.

Through the LAAA, door staff had been trained to identify vulnerable people who may be at risk of attack, and encouraged to report to police or street pastors.

The Partnership were keen to view the minutes of CAVIC and LAAAA meetings.

Members enquired about the number of reported domestic abuse incidents that were linked to alcohol, and it was discussed that a third of reports were linked to alcohol abuse, however it was believed that most reports of DV were linked to alcohol or substance misuse.

Body Cams were reviewed to identify any evidence of alcohol such as empty cans/bottles, as well as Officers reporting what they witnessed including slurring, smell etc.

AGREED that the report be noted.

SSP Community Safety Q2 (to follow) 9/16

Targets from the Community Safety Plan 2014 - 2017 were presented to the Partnership, with a brief overview.

3 items showing green, 8 showing red with 6 amber.

The report showed that there were increases in ASB and violent crime.

Item 3.3 was showing red, however it was advised that the final paragraph on the performance measure (non-opiate criminal justice clients) had brought that target down.

Item 6.1 was not measured due to lack of data. Community Safety to work with Cleveland Police Vulnerability Unit in order to address.

AGREED that the report be noted.

SSP YOT Q2 10/16

Members were presented with the YOT data summary April 2016 to March 2017 Q2. It was reported that first time entrants had increased but a reason could not be identified. Fewer young people were re-offending. Although there were increases in first time entrants the figures were still low.

AGREED that the report be noted.

SSP ARCC/CRC update 11/16

Members were given an update on ARCC/CRC. It was noted that the transformation activity was now complete across the DTV CRC and the new management was now bedded in, creating one operational division across the whole CRC area. Stockton sits within the East Team along with Hartlepool, managed by Kevin Parry.

It was reported that John Bentley currently sits on the CRC and that the Durham CRC was the only not for profit CRC and any money was re-invested. 'Thru the gate was currently being inspected. Praise was given to the Durham CRC and how it was operating and it was noted that SBC had led on the creation of the CRC.

AGREED that the update be noted.

SSP E-Cins Update 12/16

Members were presented with a report that provided an update regarding the usage of Empowering Communities Inclusion and Neighbourhood Management System, known as 'ECINS'.

Although there were numerous partners in Cleveland signed up to using ECINS the report focused on the usage of ECINS by Stockton Policing district and the local authority Community Safety Team.
