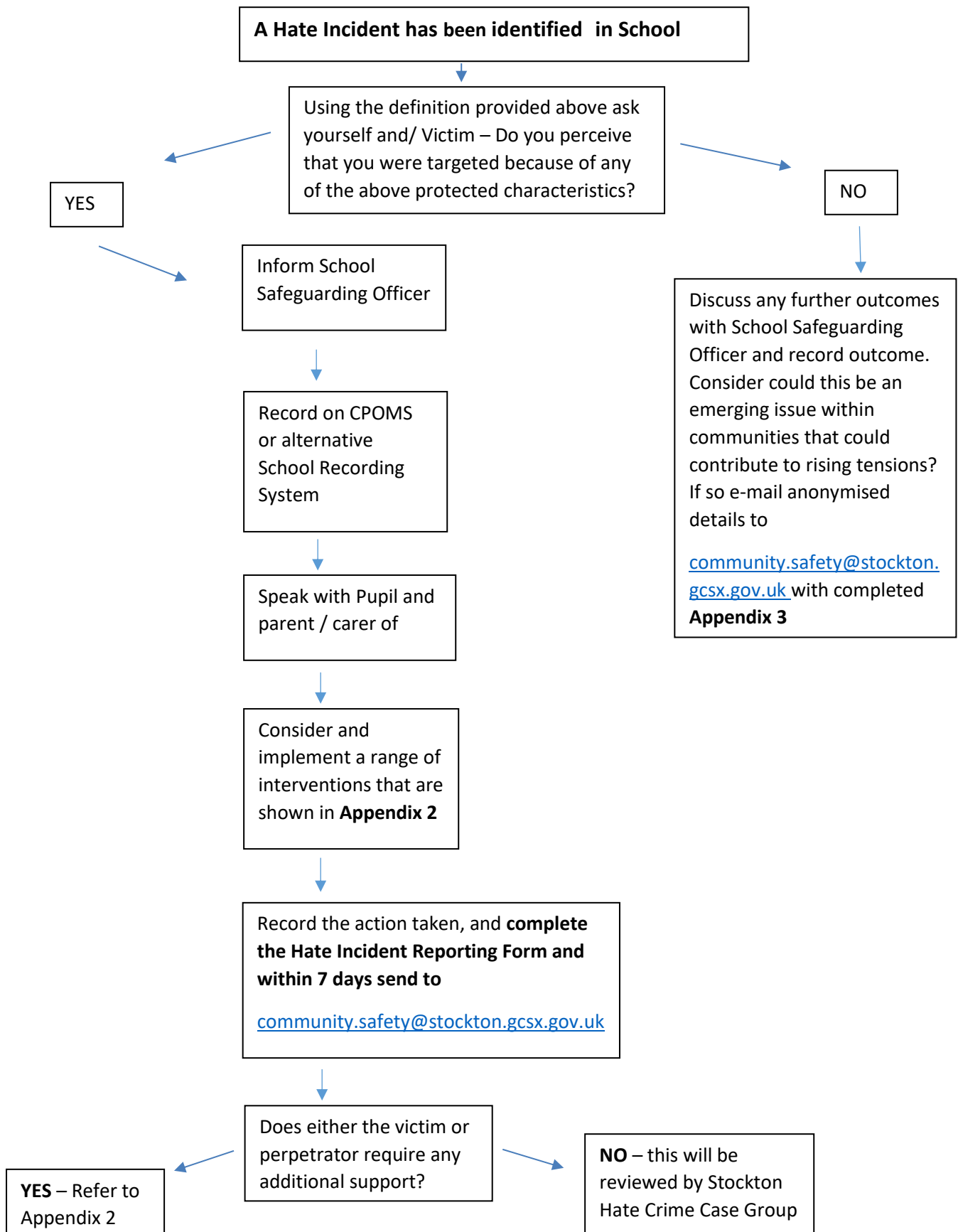


Agenda Item 8: Appendix 2

Purpose of the tension monitoring form

Tensions may manifest through mistrust, miscommunication, the breakdown of community relationships, violence (hate crime, violent extremism), isolation, criminal/physical damage, damage to the reputation of organisations, communities etc.

Therefore the aim is to build a picture of what is happening in our borough before any tensions breaks out and means communities and agencies can organise and respond accordingly through Policing, reassurance, practical activity like graffiti removal, youth diversionary activities or conflict resolution.

The aim is not to get lots of individuals to complete Tension Monitoring returns but to ensure that key network groups and organisations can feed in through Stockton hate crime group.

The process is developing a network of groups and organisations that can report tensions in confidence. The systems and arrangements for recording, sharing and deciding on action would discuss at the Stockton hate crime group.

Definition of Community Tension is

“A situation arising from acts or events that cause people to feel negative toward one another and/or services provided, putting at risk public order or threatening the peace and stability of local communities.”
