#### **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 This grant of application is made under the Licensing Act 2003 for the following licencing activities:
  - Late Night 08.00-00.00 Monday to Sunday and Bank Holidays Refreshment
  - Opening Hours 08.00-00.00 Monday to Sunday and Bank Holidays
- 1.2 The host premise was formerly a sandwich shop known as 'Truly Scrumptious' at 35A High Street, Yarm and has been granted planning permission on 5th December 2014 for a mixed use development comprising mixed use A1 retail/A5 hot food takeaway (with installation of new flue) under application reference 14/2238/COU.
- 1.3 The application site is located on Yarm High Street within the Yarm Conservation Area and defined retail centre. The unit is set over two floors with the ground floor currently in A1/A5. The unit is bounded on either side by other A1 uses and further commercial units within the wider area. To the rear is a yard area which is currently scrubland. To the rear of the neighbouring unit are residential properties (Hauxwells Yard) and these are the nearest sensitive users.
- 1.4 Other late night establishments within the vicinity of the application site have been highlighted, for clarity purposes;
  - CENA 85 High Street, Yarm to allow opening from 08.00 to 23.00 to 09.00 to 01.00 (LPA Planning ref. 04/1404/VARY).
  - No.16 High Street (12/0198/COU)
  - Lotus Lounge, Fairfax Court (13/1121/VARY) till 0100hrs daily no.26 High Street (05/3160/ARC),
  - No.49 High Street (05/2743/ARC)
  - no.115-117 High Street (13/1572/COU).
  - No.137 High Street (13/2685/COU), operate until midnight (and the premises vacated by 0100 hours)
     104 High Street (occupied by Muse) 08.00-00.30 hours (vacated by 01.00 hours), ref 14/1408/VARY
  - App.ref 15/0795/COU 30 High Street, Yarm granted opening hours till 2330hrs and vacation by 2400hrs
- 1.5 The ground floor area of the hot food establishment only measures 14sqm/150sqft. For this reason and to make the business model be efficient and to achieve financial income to support the rental and running costs of this small business, the licencee requires the additional operating hours to maintain a viable business for its longevity, which will mirror similar businesses in the vicinity.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 2.1 This premise was granted planning permission on 5th December 2014 (app.ref 14/2238/COU) for mixed use development comprising cold and Hot food takeaway at ground floor with associated storage at first floor.
- 2.2 The ground floor area of the hot food establishment only measures 14sqm/150sqft. For this reason and to make the business model be efficient and to achieve financial income to support the rental and running costs of this small business, the licencee requires the additional operating hours to maintain a viable business for its longevity, which will mirror similar businesses in the vicinity.
- 2.3 There are a number of restaurants, drinking establishments and takeaways within Yarm High Street and the opening hours vary. There have been a number of approvals restricting opening hours to 23.30 and beyond with vacation of the premises by midnight or later. The Hot food takeaway will be in close proximity to residential properties however it is also acknowledged that the area of Yarm High Street is a mixed use area with an established role for evening entertainment, it is considered that the addition operating hours of thea takeaway at this site will not significantly worsen the impact on residential properties in terms of noise and disturbance.
- 2.4 The licensee acknowledges that the approved planning hours differentiate from the proposed licencing hours within this premise licence application. However, as both legislative requirements and constraints are totally different legal concepts, the licensee aims to vary the planning condition accordingly, once this licence application has been granted (if allowed).

#### THE RELEVANT POLICIES

- 3.1 Licensing Act 2003: establishes a new single integrated scheme for licensing premises and variations that are used for the supply of alcohol and hot food after 11pm. The Act transfers responsibility for licensing of clubs and pubs and hot food take away's to local authorities and takes account of the impact of licensed premises on the wider community. Local authorities are asked to be mindful of thriving night time local economies which are important for investment and employment. It replaces a national closing time with local decisions about flexible closing times. One of the key objectives of the Act is to balance the needs of businesses with those of residents and local communities. The Act provides a framework for local authorities in developing licensing policies and assessing licensing applications. In undertaking these functions the authority should promote the licensing objectives:
  - the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - public safety;
  - the prevention of public nuisance; and
  - the protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 The Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and revised in 2006 sets out guidance to which the licensing authority must have regard when carrying out their licensing functions.

- 3.3 The Crime and Disorder Act 1998 introduced a requirement for local authorities, police and Primary Care Trusts to work together to conduct and publish an audit of local crime and disorder problems, consult locally on the findings of the audit and develop and implement a strategy for reducing crime and disorder. It placed an obligation on local authorities and the police to consider crime and disorder implications in all activities and to do all they can to prevent crime and disorder. Following a review of the Crime and Disorder Act in 2004/2005, the white paper on police reform 'Building Communities, Beating Crime' highlighted the joint approach to tackling local crime and disorder problems and issues around the misuse of drugs and alcohol and anti-social behaviour.
- 3.4 Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003: The White Paper 'Respect and Responsibility: Taking a Stand against ASB' and the Anti-Social Behaviour Bill were published in March 2003, introducing new powers and practice and outlining government policy (supporting the use of Anti-Social Behaviour Orders and Fixed Penalty Notices for Disorder). The Act required all local authorities, police and other key agencies to enforce clear standards of behaviour and gave them the tools to do so. The Act widens the powers available to shut down establishments that create noise nuisance and powers to disperse groups in designated areas suffering persistent and serious anti-social behaviour.

#### LICENSING OBJECTIVES

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- 4.1 The new licensee will achieve and maintain the main four licence objectives whilst operating this food and conferencing establishment on Yarm High Street without having a detrimental impact on the amenities and added pressures services of the local area.
- 4.2 The Government feels that it is necessary to protect revellers, other business users and local residents, as premises which serve late night refreshment, can be used by customers who may have been drinking at other establishments earlier in the evening, thereby creating the potential for disorder on and near the premises. Also, because large numbers of customers may gather at places serving late night refreshments, there is a potential for nuisance and disturbance for local residents. The regulation of late night refreshment tackles these issues and allows residents and other interested parties and responsible authorities to make representations about new, and seek reviews of existing licences where they are concerned that the licensing objectives below will be or have been affected.
- 4.3 The four licensing objectives as laid out in the Licensing Act 2003 are as follows;
  - The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - Public safety;
  - The prevention of public nuisance;
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 4.4 These 4 objectives are extremely important which the licencees have strictly adhered to from the initial granting of premise licence. The holders seek to maintain their business longevity against other establishments and provide a valuable service, as it does at present.

- 4.5 This section of street can be described as being the principal sector of the town centre with a medium scale concentration of public houses and food establishments, situated along a main public and private highway thoroughfare.
- 4.6 The analysis of this location provides a character of this locality of being a busy commercial environment, which differs from that of a traditional suburban environment; therefore a certain degree of noise and disturbance is to be expected and tolerated.
- 4.7 It is considered that the opening hours proposed of this premise is considered reasonable and would not lead to a proliferation of antisocial behaviour or noise in the area.

#### **OPERATING SCHEDULE**

5.0 In order to further reduce the impact of anti-social behaviour and to protect the local environment, the following operating schedule and previous imposed conditions will be adhered to as at present;

The application is a mixed use as A1/A5 food establishment facility with no consumption of alcohol by such persons.

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#### The prevention of Crime and Disorder

- Dynamic 16 Full Colour HD quality CCTV cameras and associated Colour LED monitor; up to 3 cameras positioned in the premise at ground floor only with appropriate Digital Video Recording system with date stamp with 2TB hard drive
- CCTV will continue to record 24 hours a day and will retain the footage for a
  period of 31 days. The recording equipment will be able to produce copied
  footage on a disc which will be made available on request by the
  police of other responsible authorities. A member of staff who can
  operate and make copies of the footage will always be on duty when the
  premise is open for business.
- An incident book will be used to record all incidents of crime and disorder.
- Previous members of the public who have caused problems will not be allowed into the premises and told politely to leave the premise.
- No children under the age of 16 will be allowed into the premises unaccompanied after 10pm
- Pub watch radio system/ring round phone systems to ensure communication from other establishments provide assistance with known offending customers being in the locality. (if required by the Cleveland Constabulary)
- Staff Policy will be in place to promote the duty of care for dealing with patrons suffering adversely from the effects of alcohol/drugs and victims of disorder

#### **Public Safety**

The premises has been equipped relevant fire safety equipment such as fire blankets and 2no.4kg powder fire extinguishers at ground and first floor levels. All other checks have been carried out by competent persons for the following elements;

- 1. Electrical
- 2. Building Safety
- 3. Fire Safety
- 4. Ventilation
- Health and Safety and First Aid training will be provided to all members of staff
- All members of staff will be trained in Fire Safety
- Appropriate fire precautions are in place i.e. fire extinguishers, fire blankets, fire exit signs and emergency lighting.

#### The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- Signs will be placed in the shop asking people to leave the premises quietly
- Entrance door shall be remained closed to suppress the egress of noise from premise
- Customers will be advised to disperse of litter in allocated bins outside or in the premise and refuse storage will be kept in rear service yard of building
- Staff members will clean premise thoroughly and maintain a record in writing
- Staff members will remove any associated litter from the establishment found outside the business premise to avoid vermin infestation
- Regular maintenance of extraction flue systems and carbon filters to control odour nuisance
- No alcohol will be served on premise or brought onto premise by customers.
- Staff will be trained to recognise inebriated customers
- Supervisor and employees will be notified where all registry documents and licence details are kept for disclosure upon request from Licence officer visiting the premise.
- Safety notices to be displayed
- The display of contact details or a direct telephone link to a private hire/taxi firm will be placed within the premise
- Provision of bins for cigarette litter will be provided to the front of the premise
- Effective waste collection arrangements to ensure that waste collections are not made at times which are likely to cause disturbance to nearby residents and businesses

The protection of children from harm.

- No children under the age of 16 will be allowed into the premises unaccompanied after 10pm
- 5.1 It is to be addressed once more, that the licencee will provide a good track record maintaining a clean bill of health in achieving the licensing objectives as at present
- 5.2 For transparency the applicant is willing to accept additional protection measures such as a higher number of inspection visits to ensure that the premise is not a high risk, which will show that the premise is well managed and maintained.
- 5.3 It is therefore considered that the proposed variation of opening hours will not have an adverse impact on the amenity of the neighbouring properties and will bring this commercial premise in line with similar uses in the immediate area.

#### CONCLUSION

- 6.0 As demonstrated above, the request for granting Premise Licence for days and opening hours proposed for the associated uses, would not have an adverse impact on any of the four licensing objectives;
  - The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - Public safety;
  - The prevention of public nuisance;
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 6.1 The operating schedule highlights how crime and disorder will be prevented, how public safety will be protected, how noise and disturbance will be kept to a minimum and how children will be protected from harm.
- 6.2 It is considered that it has been demonstrated that allowing variation of existing hours for the sale of hot food to be consumed of the premises would fully accord with;
  - The Crime and Disorder Act 1998
