LICENSING ACT 2003
APPLICATION FOR VARIATION
BLACKWELL'S BUTCHERS LIMITED, 122 HIGH STREET, NORTON, STOCKTON ON TEES

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to determine an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to which there has been a representation from an Interested Party.

RECOMMENDATION

That Members determine the application.

THE APPLICATION

- 1. An application for variation has been received from Blackwell's Butchers Limited, in relation to Blackwell's Butcher, 122 High Street, Norton, Stockton on Tees. The proposed variation is for the following:
 - To extend the hours for recorded music and supply of alcohol on and off the premises on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday from: 09.00 until 21.00 to 09.00 until 23.00
 - To add Sunday 09.00 until 20.00
 - To extend the opening hours from: 07.30 until 18.30 to 07.00 until 23.00
 - To add Sunday 09.00 until 20.00
 - These extensions are to allow the shop to open on an evening and weekends for private catering events and small dining experiences (maximum 20 guests) and not for general retail purposes.

A copy of the existing licence is attached at Appendix 2 for information.

RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

2. Following discussions with Cleveland Police the applicant has agreed to conditions being attached to the licence. Copy of the agreed condition is attached at Appendix 3.

3. Seven representations have been received from Interested Parties. Copies of these are attached at Appendix 4.

One other representation was withdrawn as their objection was to about the 09:00am start on a Sunday and the applicant did agree to amend this to 11:00am.

- ii) Where an application to vary a premises licence is granted (in whole or in part) the applicant may appeal against any decision to modify the conditions of the licence; and where a person who made relevant representation in relation to the application desires to contend -
- a) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
- b) that, when varying the licence, the licensing authority ought not to have modified the conditions of the licence, or ought to have modified them in a different way, he may appeal against that decision.

Any conditions imposed should reduce the potential for crime and disorder.
