SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to determine an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to which there has been representations from a Responsible Authority and Interested Parties.

To amend the hours for Live Music From Monday to Sunday 12.00 – 24.00 to 11.00 – 23.30

To amend the hours for Recorded Music From Monday to Sunday 12.00 – 24.00 to 09.00 – 23.30

To amend the hours for Supply of Alcohol On the premises From Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 24.00 to 11.00 – 23.30

To amend the hours for Supply of Alcohol Off the premises From Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 22.00 to 11.00 – 23.30

To amend the opening hours on Sunday From 11.00 – 24.00 to 10.00 – 24.00

To add outside drinking/seating area to front and side of premises until 21.00 and rear of the premises until 23.00

To remove the following condition from the licence

"Alcohol shall not be removed from the designated licensed area in open containers".

• The prevention of public nuisance

Legal Implications:

- i) Where a licensing authority rejects (in whole or in part) an application to vary a premises licence the applicant may appeal against that decision.
- ii) Where an application to vary a premises licence is granted (in whole or in part) the applicant may appeal against any decision to modify the conditions of the licence; and where a person who made relevant representation in relation to the application desires to contend -
- a) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
- b) that, when varying the licence, the licensing authority ought not to have modified the conditions of the licence, or ought to have modified them in a different way, he may appeal against that decision.

Community Safety Implications:

Any conditions imposed should reduce the potential for crime and disorder.
