

ANNEX 1

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- **No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:**
 - (a) at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- **Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**
- **When door supervisors or other persons carrying out security activities at specified times are employed such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.**

For the purposes of this condition "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 applies.

- **1. The admission of children under 18 to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with any classification and recommendation in respect of that film made by the British Board of Film Classification or any other film classification body designated under Section 4 of the Video Recording Act 1984.**
 - 2. Notwithstanding the above condition a film may be exhibited and children under 18 may be admitted thereto if the permission of Stockton Borough Council is first obtained and any condition of such permission are complied with. For the purpose of this condition the venue operator must submit any film to the council that it intends to exhibit 28 days before it is proposed to show it.**
- **(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.**
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-**
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -**
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or**
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);**

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premise supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

- A. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
- B. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph A -
 - (a) "duty" is to construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P=D+(D \times V)$$
 Where-
 - (i) P is the permitted price
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premise supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- C. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph B would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny
- D. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph B on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

PREVENTION OF CRIME & DISORDER

- **Routine and random searches at large events will be carried out. If illegal substances are found within any event, Police and Enforcement will be contacted, substances will be confiscated and if possible, the perpetrator will be detained by security staff. Any signage suggested by Police referring to "zero tolerance" on drugs will be displayed in all areas of the event site.**
- **There will be a secured drugs box on site.**
- **For events open to the general public, trained security staff will be on entry/exit points of the event site. Receptacles will be made available to place all confiscated containers on entry and exiting the site. Site boundaries will be clearly defined and secured by the appropriate means as agreed within each specific event plan.**
- **Event contractors will contract only SIA registered companies/staff as stated in the specific event plan.**
- **Crowd numbers and density will be monitored using methods agreed at the specific event planning stage and will vary from event to event, as deemed appropriate. Methods used will include ticketing, hand held counters and "crowd counting".**
- **At all events alcohol sold will be dispensed into plastic vessels unless otherwise agreed within the specific event plan.**
- **A specific event plan (as detailed in the operating schedule) will be submitted to and agreed with the Police and other Responsible Authorities at least 28 days prior to an event taking place, which includes the sale of alcohol.**
- **Sale of alcohol will only take place when events are held as set out in a specified event plan.**

PUBLIC SAFETY

- **Fire evacuation notices and fire fighting equipment will be prominently displayed at all times.**
- **There shall be maintained on the premises at all times an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials.**
- **A designated member of staff shall be aware of the number of persons on the premises to ensure safety limits are not exceeded.**
- **All designated escape routes shall be marked and maintained to provide free and unobstructed access.**

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- Each event shall have event planning documentation which shall be available upon request to the Environmental Health Unit prior to the event, and for major events shall be provided to the Environmental Health Unit prior to the event.
- For any events the sound pressure level in the 63 and 125Hz frequency bands shall not exceed 70dB measured one metre from the facade of any noise sensitive properties. A written record shall be made of those assessments and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action. All records shall be retained for one year.
- There shall be no more than 12 firework displays per year. All displays shall finish at 23.00 (with the exemption of New Year's Eve).
- All regulated entertainment shall be planned to finish at 23.00, however, this may continue until 23.30 due to exceptional circumstances only, the reasons for which must be recorded in writing.
- For all events the entertainment noise level shall not exceed 65L_{aeq} (15 mins) measured at one metre from the facade of any noise sensitive premises. A written record shall be made of those assessments and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action. All records shall be retained for one year.
- An emergency telephone number shall be publicised and made available for the handling of any complaints which may arise. A log of any complaints shall be maintained and be made available for inspection by officers from the Environmental Health Unit.
- No light from or on the site and any other light under the control of the event organisers shall be provided where that light causes a nuisance to any nearby premises.
- There shall be 28 days notice of each event where alcohol is to be served.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

- Those persons not deemed or appearing to be 21 years of age when attempting to purchase alcohol will be asked for proof of age and when only a passport, driving licence or any other legitimate photo ID that may be introduced as a result of future legislation will be accepted.
