The applicant states that 'The premises is a casual restaurant/café which seats

approximately 40-50 people'.

This premise is situated on Norton High Street at the junction of Mill Street and the licensed

part of the premises occupies the ground floor of the building. Norton High Street is a

vibrant area of Stockton and has many other licensed premises selling alcohol as well as

premises selling hot food to take away.

Norton High Street also suffers from crime and anti social behaviour which has been well

documented.

On the application under the licensing objectives there is no mention of a CCTV system to

be fitted.

The applicant also states under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective that

'Customers can enjoy an alcoholic beverage with their meal but will not be allowed

to consume large amounts of alcohol and become heavily intoxicated on the

premises'.

I have spoken to the applicant about this and I have e-mailed her a list of conditions that

Cleveland Police believe would be satisfactory for this premises.

I have attached a copy of these conditions which I exhibit as JRJ/1.

The applicant replied stating that she agreed with conditions 2-8 but she is financially

unable to install costly CCTV citing the reason for applying for the licence as a means to

increase income as soon as possible.

She also stated that she could not agree to condition 9 as it would give her premises an

unfair disadvaptage to other premises on the High Street.

I have attached a copy of this e-mail which I exhibit as JRJ/2.

Cleveland Police are of the opinion that as the premises wants to sell alcohol then a CCTV system would be essential to prevent any crime and disorder and also be there for the safety of staff and customers.

As previously stated Norton High Street has suffered from crime and disorder with a number of premises also being unfortunate to have been broken into.

Neanderthals itself has suffered a burglary and whilst having a CCTV system would not necessarily prevent this occurring, it may act as a deterrent in the future.

The benefit of having a CCTV system was also demonstrated on Friday 9th March 2018 when I attended a licensed premise on Norton High Street on behalf of a colleague who asked for footage of an assault which occurred inside the premises then escalated to the footpath outside.

I identified the altercation inside the premises and CCTV was downloaded which will be used to prove that the incident occurred and also that the persons named were present.

There has also been a recently reported rise in anti social behaviour around the Norton High Street area.

Large groups of young persons have been committing acts of ASB and minor criminal damage and have also entered several licensed premises causing disorder.

Cleveland Police are of the opinion that having a working CCTV system would be beneficial to identifying any person engaged in such activities.

I have carried out analysis of incidents involving licensed premises in Norton High Street showing incidents of crime and anti social behaviour.

This analysis has been gathered from Police systems and is from 1st September 2017 until the date of this statement.

I have restricted the analysis only to on licensed premises and whilst I have not included every incident, the list gives a snapshot of the type of incidents that are being reported to Police. All incidents are prior to 22:00hrs which is the terminal hour for this application.

I exhibit this list as JRJ/3.

The applicant has also submitted seven (7) temporary event notices (TEN) in relation to her premises, the first being received on 6th February 2018.

All of these notices are to allow the supply of alcohol at the premises from 11:00hrs until 22:00hrs.

All except the first notice state that the event is 'To serve alcoholic beverages with meals'

On the actual premises application the applicant has stated 'Customers can enjoy an alcoholic beverage with their meal but will not be allowed to consume large amounts of alcohol and become heavily intoxicated on the premises'.

The TEN notices also state this so I have asked the applicant to have this as a condition on the licence to this effect with the caveat of allowing 30 persons to be able to consume alcohol without a meal.

Cleveland police are of the opinion that this is a fair compromise as it allows at least half of her customers to be able to drink without a meal.

She has refused to accept this stating her premises would be at an unfair advantage to other premises on the High Street.

If this is the case then Cleveland Police are of the opinion that a working CCTV system should be in operation.

1, A digital Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped.

The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard-drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with Data Protection legislation.

CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of **evidential quality** in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.

Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

There will be a minimum of 31 days recording.

The system will record for 24 hours a day.

The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any desktop computer.

The Digital recorder will have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images.

There will be at all times a member of staff who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from a governing body, such as Cleveland Police or any other Responsible Authority, be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time, e.g. 24hrs routine or less if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.

2, Alcohol shall not be removed from the designated licensed area in open containers.

- 3, All staff will be fully trained and the training must include the laws relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons, persons buying on behalf of under 18s (proxy sales), persons appearing to be under the influence of alcohol and also the operation of the associated 'Challenge 25' policy. Staff will receive refresher training at least every 6 months.
- 4, Training records, signed by both the staff member and the Designated Premise Supervisor/Store Manager/Business Owner will be retained for future reference and shall be updated at least every 6 months. All staff training records will be made available to the Licensing Authority and/or Responsible Authorities upon request.
- 5, The business will maintain a refusals book to record all instances where the sale of alcohol has been refused. This shall include the date and time of the attempted

sale, together with a description of the incident. The Designated Premise Supervisor/Store Manager/Business Owner will check and sign each page and the refusals book will be made available to the Licensing Authority and/or Responsible Authorities upon request.

- 6, The business will maintain an incident book to record all instances where the staff deal with people who have been unruly, drunk, abusive, aggressive or have committed criminal acts or have had to call police for such incidents. This shall include the date and time of the incident, together with a description of the incident and whether the police were called/attended. The Designated Premise Supervisor/Store Manager/Business Owner will check and sign each page and the incident book will be made available to the Licensing Authority and/or Responsible Authorities upon request.
- 7, There will be a minimum of two notices displayed on the premise indicating that the sale of alcohol to those under the age of 18 is illegal and that those adults who buy alcohol for immediate disposal to those under age the age of 18 are committing an offence.
- 8, Children under the age of 18 years shall be accompanied by a responsible parent/guardian. Children will not be allowed at the bar or to remain in the premises beyond 21:00 hours.
- 9, Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied at the premise otherwise than to persons taking table meals and for consumption by such persons as ancillary to their meal.

However, an exception is made for a maximum of 30 people to consume alcoholic drinks without a table meal in the premises at any given time

Hello James

Thank you for your email.

After careful consideration I am unable to agree to the conditions for the following reasons:

Restriction 1 - We are financially unable (as a new business) to install costly CCTV. The reason we have applied for the licence is because we need to increase our income as soon as possible.

Restriction 2-8 - I don't have a problem with these conditions.

Restriction 9- This condition would give us an unfair disadvantage to the other businesses on the high street and would prevent us from hiring out the deli for functions which is part of our future business plan. We are financially unable to turn away customers wishing to sit in our deli/restaurant to have a civilised drink because they are not looking to purchase a meal.

We are already heavily restricted by the council including that we have to close as 10pm. I must protect the future of the business and the local people who we employ and who rely on us for their livelihood.
