SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to determine an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to which there has been representations from a Responsible Authority and from Interested Parties.

RECOMMENDATION

That Members determine the application.

THE APPLICATION

- 1. An application for variation has been received from Punch Taverns Limited, in relation to The Parkwood Hotel, 64-66 Darlington Road, Stockton-On-Tees TS18 5ER. The proposed variation is for the following:
 - To vary the layout and design of the premises with the addition of a marquee in the external area. The existing internal layout is to remain unchanged.
 - To add the following conditions to the premise licence:
 - 1. The external marquee will not be used beyond 11pm on any day it is operated.
 - 2. Regular checks of the marquee and garden area will include the removal of empty glasses and bottles, when the marquee is operated.
 - 3. The external bar marquee will be operated by a minimum of two staff members when it is in use.
 - 4. Staff will perform checks around the marquee area and external garden every hour to monitor customer behaviour and noise levels. Findings will be logged and made available to inspecting officers from the local authority and/or police upon reasonable request.
 - To remove all Embedded Restrictions from the premises licence operating schedule.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

 You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy

 Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.

Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

Live music: no licence permission is required for:

 a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

 a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

 a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital. • Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

 any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

 Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.

 Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:

 any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;

 any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;

 any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor;

 any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).

 For example state type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.



- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2)The designated premise supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider:1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky:25ml or 35ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass:125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

- A. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
 - B. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph A -
 - (a) "duty" is to construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P=D+(DxV)

Where-

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premise supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- C. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph B would (apart from this paragraph)not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny
- D. (1)Sub-paragraph(2)applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph B on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after these hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel:
- (b) during the first thirty minutes after these hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (c) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.





2) The Council, police and local residents have had historical problems with this venue (2000, 2001 and 2005) which resulted in significant financial costs to the Council and police as well as public nuisance to local residents. Councillor Lupton was our Councillor at that time and will be able to provide details.
3) Public Safety: The existing parking facilities are inadequate. Events currently held in the Parkwood Hotel often result in parking on the main Darlington Road causing difficulty with sight lines at entrances and the adjoining roads are inadequate for extra parking.
4) Public Nuisance: Hours of operation: The licence application does not indicate the days when the marquee will be operated. I believe the days of operating should be limited to a Friday, Saturday and any Sunday on a bank holiday weekend and the hours of operation finish at 10.00pm to allow for drinking up and clearing away to be completed by 11.00 pm bearing in mind the noise of late departing guests, taxis, cars etc. If any later noise disturbance will continue until well after midnight to the detriment of local residents who are a mix of elderly, working aged people and school children. It would be unfair and unjustified for their rest to be affected the impact of which would be felt on the following days.



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

Section 4 – Representation Grounds

Recent changes and management at The Parkwood Hotel has resulted in an increase in clientele and business activity, which we acknowledge as being a necessity in the current economic climate. Whilst we are in favour of this and do support the ongoing success of all businesses in the area we have some reservation on this Licencing Variation.

Prevention of Public Nuisance:

The proposed amendment to the licence is for a 12m x6m permanent marguee structure located in a garden area of the licence premises. An outside beer garden currently exists giving rise to behaviour and excessive noise which is frequently approaching levels which are bordering on being a nuisance to neighbouring properties and the general vicinity. The proposed marquee is clearly an attempt to extend the current outdoor drinking facilities and periods of the year it can be used. The proposed provisions for staff and hours of use will not provide adequate control to prevent the premises as a whole tipping over the point of becoming a source of regular nuisance. This is based on current observation of what is tolerated by existing management supervision, and at times what appears to be an inadequate presence of experienced staff capable of dealing with the recent increases in business. The proposed time limit of 11.00 pm does not make it clear whether this is a limit by which the marquee would have to be vacated, with an earlier time limit for cessation of serving drinks. Unless this is specified it would be argued that the marquee does not need to be cleared any earlier than the times specified in the licence for the main premises. This can be as late as 00.30 at weekends. Furthermore there should be no music permitted either recorded or live performance as there would be little or no reduction in sound being transmitted into the open garden area. In summary there has to be a balance between enabling a business to thrive and the impact that activity has when it deprives residents from enjoying their own properties in a reasonable manner. This proposal is totally inconsistent within a residential environment particularly due to the very close proximity to adjacent properties and the quiet nature of the area.

Protection of Children From Harm:

The garden currently (rightly or wrongly) has facilities which attracts children outside and away from supervising adults whether or not meals are being eaten. Any additional structure and it's use can only increase the risks associated with the mixture of children and activities associated with licensed premises. The proposed marquee structure will only make supervision of children more difficult. Perhaps any future increase in business activity would be better served by a permanent addition to the existing building, rather than an ad hoc temporary type structure. This would allow proper consideration of all the factors and how best to resolve them.

Public Safety:

The recent change of management has attracted an increase in trade to the premises, with a corresponding increase of traffic. This is both private cars and more significantly private hire taxis and minibuses. The effects are compounded. The Parkwood existing limited parking has now become inadequate, with frequent parking out on the roadside of Darlington Road, causing restricted visibility on the approach to an already complicated junction at Greens Lane and Hartburn Village crossroad. Safe access / egress to residential driveways are being affected, the road leading into The Spinney being a case in point.
