#### **SUMMARY**

The purpose of this report is for Members to consider an application for review of a premise licence from Cleveland Police.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

That Members determine the application.

#### THE APPLICATION

- An application for a review of the premise licence in respect of The Clock Tower, 96-96a
  High Street, Stockton-On-Tees has been received from Cleveland Police. A copy together
  with supporting evidence is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2. Members are advised that these premises currently have the benefit of a premise licence that permits the supply of alcohol on & off the premises, provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATION**

 Members are respectfully reminded of the need to give due consideration to Stockton Borough Councils Licensing Policy Statement and the Section 182 Revised Guidance issued April 2018 under the Licensing Act 2003 when considering this application for review.

- 6. Part 11 of the Guidance deals with 'Reviews' and at paragraph 11.18 it states:
  - ".....However, where responsible authorities like the police and environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement either orally or in writing that have failed as part of their approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach and should take this into account when considering what further action is appropriate."

### Paragraph 11.28 of the Guidance states:

"It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedure effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.

- 7. A copy of the policy documents will be available at the meeting for Members information and details regarding the full range of powers available to members can be found at Paragraphs 11.16 to 11.28 of the Guidance.
- 8. Members must carry out their functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public safety
  - The prevention of public nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm

#### **MEMBERS OPTIONS**

- 8. Members are advised that under the provisions of Section 51(4) The Licensing Act 2003 the authority may, at any time, reject any ground for review if it is satisfied
  - (a) that the ground is not relevant to one or more of the licensing objectives, or
  - (b) in the case of an application made by a person other than a responsible authority, that-
    - (i) the ground is frivolous or vexatious, or
    - (ii) the ground is a repetition
- 9. If Members are not minded to reject the application, then under the provisions of Section 52(3) The Licensing Act 2003, the authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations take such steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives.

The steps are –

- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence which could include reducing opening hours or requiring door supervisors at a particular time;
- (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence:
- (c) to remove the designated premise supervisor for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
- (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- (e) to revoke the licence

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

Where the authority takes a step mentioned in (a) or (b), it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.

10. The Committee also have the option to leave the licence in its existing state.

This application to review relates to the following licensing objective(s)

Cleveland Police make an application to review the premises licence at the Clocktower for the following reasons:

At 19:15hrs on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2017 an incident occurred at the Clocktower between two male customers. Whilst outside the venue an altercation took place which resulted in a 55 year old man receiving life threatening head injuries. The victim was in an induced coma for 11 days with a fractured skull and a bleed on the brain. The male has since regained consciousness but his injuries are so severe it is not possible to say what impact they will have on the remainder of his life.

This incident is one of a catalogue of violent crimes which have occurred at the premises within the last 12 months

Steps have been taken to work with the premise, including three formal meetings in the past 12 months between Police, Council officials and the management of the venue to help alleviate the issues at the premise. The premise also came up with it's own list of Actions to try and help. Police have maintained regular contact with the management of the premises in between these meetings.

Unfortunately the issues have continued and have culminated in some serious assaults which have resulted in serious injuries for the victims. Some of the incidents involve door staff and are captured on CCTV including door staff choking a customer, attacking a customer with a metal barrier and throwing a customer out of the venue onto the pavement and road outside.

Despite being made aware of the incidents and the Police concerns the violence has continued culminating in the incident on the 6<sup>th</sup> of October. Cleveland Police are of the view that the Licensing Objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety are being undermined. This has left Cleveland Police with no recourse but to seek a review of the premise licence before an even worse incident takes place at the venue.

The premise has been known by several names in the past, most notably Ibiza bar and the

Funky Lime.

Whilst known as the Funky Lime the premises had the licence reviewed by Cleveland

Police due to incidents of crime and disorder.

This review took place on the 28<sup>th</sup> February 2015.

Prior to the hearing the licence was transferred from the licence holder to the owner of the

building, Mistell Ltd however the hearing went ahead and the decision was made to

remove the designated premises supervisor (DPS).

I have attached the decision letter which lists the names of all persons present during this

hearing.

I have attached a copy of this letter which I exhibit as JRJ/1.

The premises closed before a further transfer was submitted with Mr McAllister named as

the premises licence holder.

The premises then re-opened as the Clock Tower.

In the time that Mr McAllister has been at the Clock Tower I have spoken to him on

numerous occasions regarding the premises as I do with other licensees.

On the 1st October 2017 an incident took place at the premises where persons were

assaulted and a noxious substance was sprayed at customers of the premises on the High

Street.

Pc Thorpe has provided a statement detailing all the noteworthy incidents of crime and disorder at the premises. This incident is referred to as incident 1.

This incident took place when the premises held an event called 'Clubberland'

On the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2017 a meeting was held at Stockton library as a result of this incident.

Present at the meeting was Sgt Higgins, Polly Edwards from Stockton council and myself and also Mr McAllister and his solicitor Matt Foster.

The footage was shown from the incident on the 1<sup>st</sup> October as well as other incidents at the premises.

Later that day, I received an e-mail from Mr Foster detailing a list of actions that would be undertaken by the premises.

I have attached a copy of this e-mail which I exhibit as JRJ/2.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> November 2017 I also received an e-mail from Mr McAllister with an update in respect of the meeting.

I have attached a copy of this which I exhibit as JRJ/3.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> December 2017 I received a telephone call from Mr McAllister following an incident at the premises on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December when a further 'Clubberland' event was held.

A male had been assaulted in the toilets of the premises and there was an allegation of a noxious substance being sprayed outside the premises.

I requested a copy of the CCTV from inside the premises which was supplied.

Following this I was asked by Mr McAllister regarding temporary event notices (TEN) over the Christmas period.

He was advised that Police would object to any TEN's however he did submit a TEN without objection for the 27<sup>th</sup> December until 2am.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2018 a further meeting was held at Stockton library with Sgt Higgins, Polly Edwards from Stockton council and myself.

Present from the Clock Tower was Mr McAllister and a female member of staff.

This was a follow up meeting after the Christmas period where Mr McAllister advised us that he was not going to do any more 'Clubberland' events.

Following this meeting I continued to monitor the incidents at the premises and a further meeting was held on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2018 at Stockton library with Sgt Higgins, Polly Edwards and myself with Mr McAllister and a female member of staff from the Clock Tower.

At this meeting we discussed incidents at the premises and he was also shown footage from an incident on the 12<sup>th</sup> May 2018 which occurred on Stockton High Street outside his premises. This is incident 8 in the statement of Pc Thorpe.

Mr McAllister asked about the possibility of him applying for a licence extension to allow him to sell alcohol until 3am on a Friday and Saturday but he was advised that if he did submit an application Police would make representations objecting to this.

Since this meeting there have been further incidents of violence at the premises which have been detailed by Pc Thorpe.

I have visited the premises and spoken to Mr McAllister and staff members about some of these incidents as well as requesting CCTV footage for example the incident on the 6<sup>th</sup> October 2018 which is incident 14 in Pc Thorpe's statement.

during the day and on Friday and Saturday nights, especially at the core times of the Night Time Economy. The premises currently holds a Premise Licence for on and off sales of alcohol until midnight on Mondays and Tuesday, until 01:00 hours on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Sundays and until 02:00 hours on Fridays and Saturdays. The closing time for the premise is half an hour after these times.

The Clock Tower's Premise Licence is held by Mr Andrew McAllister who is also named as the Designated Premise Supervisor (DPS). The premise licence in it's current form has been in place since 13<sup>th</sup> July 2017.

The premise has unfortunately been a victim of some violent incidents over the past 13 months some of which have involved serious injury to the victims. I have produced a DVD containing CCTV footage of some of the incidents which I will exhibit as AJT/1 for the purposes of a hearing. I have detailed the violent incidents below:

1. 1<sup>st</sup> October 2017 at around 01:22 hours a male is ejected by door staff and a group of males follow him out. Some of this group appear to be with the male, but two others are not and an altercation occurs outside resulting in fighting. One of the males sprays a substance which affects a number of people who all run back in to the venue. The substance is believed to be pepper spray or CS Incapacitant gas. This situation is exacerbated by another fight inside the doors of the Clock Tower as door staff try to eject a male from there, knocking over glasses as they try to control the situation. Later that night, the male seen on CCTV spraying the substance in the initial melee, is seen

leaving the Clock Tower and standing in the smoking area where he is confronted by a female who door staff have to hold back. One of the door staff speaks to the male who then walks off. This was one of the events in relation to which The Clock Tower applied for a Temporary Event Notice to extend their licensable activity hours. The incident was reported by the manager of the Clock Tower. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/1. For the purpose of any hearing I will refer to this as Incident 1.

- 2. 13<sup>th</sup> October 2017 at around 21:58 hours a male is arguing with door staff and other people at the front of The Clock Tower. The arguing male strikes another customer without warning. The male who had been struck and another go after another male (not the assailant). They confront the male who stops and turns towards them. The initial victim and another male attack the new male knocking him to the ground and continuing to beat him whilst he is still on the ground. Door staff intervene at which point the attackers then turn on the door staff. The situation is dealt with but no police are called to the incident and no complaints are made. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/1. For the purposes of any hearing I will refer to this as Incident 2.
- 3. 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2017 at around 01:30 hours a male victim heads to the toilets. He is confronted by another male who hits him on the back of the head with a bottle which causes the male victim to fall to the floor and whilst down on the floor the assailant throws another bottle at him. The male victim has recovered enough to get up and run after his assailant and another male he was with. He goes up the alleyway next to the premise after them and before re-appearing on the High Street again with his top off, he

has been sprayed in the face with a noxious liquid believed to be CS incapacitant spray by one of the males. The victim now appears to be looking for retribution, at the door of The Clock Tower trying to get in and get at the males he believes are responsible. This results in further fighting with door staff restraining one male to get him out of The Clock Tower, knocking barriers over in the fracas. Door staff are at one point holding the initial victim (topless) back while police have another male restrained. This assault resulted in the victim sustaining lacerations to the side of the face which required treatment. This was reported by the premises at the time as a fight occurring, and was later reported by the victim as an assault. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/1. For the purposes of any hearing I will refer to this as Incident 3.

- 4. On 14<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at around 23:05 hours, staff have called police call takers to advise of a female who has been drinking in the premises and is very drunk. She has become aggressive with the DJ and staff matters could escalate. The DJ has not been assaulted and when police arrive they take the female to her home address to prevent any disorder. I will refer to this as Incident 4 for the purposes of a hearing.
- 5. On 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018 at approximately 02:30 hours Andrew McAllister, the premises licence holder, has contacted police call takers and reported a male who has been ejected from The Clock Tower is acting aggressively towards the door staff, offering violence and threatening to bring other people down. Council CCTV are monitoring the situation and see the male take a swing at a person they believe to be door staff. Police attend and speak to Andrew McAllister who states he does not wish to take the matter any further and just wants the male moving on. This was again one of the events in relation to

which the premise was allowed a Temporary Event Notice to extend their licensable activity hours. I will refer to this as Incident 5 for the purposes of any hearing.

- 6. On 1<sup>st</sup> May 2018 at around 21:00 hours, the male victim had been in The Clock Tower "all day", he was finishing his last pint of the day before heading home when he saw a male heading towards the toilets point towards him. The male came back out of the toilets headed towards the victim and without provocation has punched him in the mouth. The assailant left the premises and went into another public house. The victim sustained a cut and swelling to his lip. No one from the premise has reported this incident. I will refer to this as Incident 6 for the purposes of any hearing.
- 7. On 7<sup>th</sup> May 2018 at around 20:15 hours Andrew McAllister contacts police to advise that a male assailant has hit another customer. McAllister states to the call taker that he believes the male to be one involved in an incident the previous night with his girlfriend, so he was asked to leave. The male has now returned and hit a customer and thrown glasses around. The name of the male is not known, bar staff and management are not aware of the male. Fortunately no one was seriously hurt and no one was willing to come forward to make a complaint. I will refer to this incident as Incident 7 for the purposes of any hearing.
- 8. On 12<sup>th</sup> May 2018 at around 02:10 hours a male is put out of the Clock Tower by door staff for his behaviour. The male remonstrates with the door staff becoming increasingly agitated and constantly approaching the door staff and gesticulating. One of the door staff grabs hold of the male around the upper body area and after a while the male goes limp. The member of door staff drags the male across to the nearest free wall and props the male up in a seated position. He slaps the male lightly on the cheek a couple of

times and the male opens his eyes and as the door staff walk away the male gets up. The male immediately goes back across to towards the Clock Tower entrance. At this point a male patron from out of the Clock Tower approaches him and pushes him back. The male victim is then given a bigger push by the male patron and is sent sprawling to the floor. The male patron quickly goes over to the male victim and bending over him delivers three quick punches to the face and head area of the male victim. The male patron is allowed to walk away, only stopping to shout at a female who remonstrates with him. The male victim gets up unsteadily to his feet. He has suffered some residual neck injuries but fortunately no lasting visible injuries. This incident, again, was not reported by the premise and was only picked up by police due to CCTV footage being sent to the police for review. As a result police officers spoke to the victim who made a complaint against the assailants. As a result of investigations the unknown assailant was identified interviewed and received a caution for his assault on the victim. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/1. I will refer to this as Incident 8 for the purposes of any hearing.

9. On 27<sup>th</sup> May 2018 at around 22:35 hours the victim was in The Clock Tower with her partner where they had been enjoying a night out. CCTV footage from the premise shows an unknown male punching the female victim causing the victim to stumble backwards a fair distance and fall to the floor where she ends up on her side motionless. The male assailant then delivers at least one more blow while the female is lying motionless on the floor. The door staff restrain the male and lead him out of the front door where he leaves in an unknown direction. The female suffers serious injury, including a fractured eye socket which she is seeking specialist treatment for. The

incident was not reported by the premise and was only reported the next day by the victim after she was attended to in hospital. As a result of this the male was not identified, CCTV were not made aware so were unable to follow the male and alert police. Police now have the task of trying to identify the male and bring him to justice. In fact the police have again recently released CCTV images to the media to try and identify the suspect. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/1. I will refer to this as Incident 9 for the purposes of any hearing.

- 10.On 7<sup>th</sup> July 2018 at around 00:10 hours, door staff restrain a violent male who they ejected from the premise. The male was inside The Clock Tower when he became aggressive whilst on the dance floor. The door staff have asked the male to leave, which he has refused to do. Door staff have attempted to escort him out of the premise but the male has become increasingly aggressive and punched one of the door staff in the face causing reddening and scratch marks. The incident has been reported to the police who attend but feel the male is too aggressive to transport without a van. The male was restrained on the ground. Whilst the initial incident was reported the door staff declined to take the matter any further so the male was not charged with the offence. I will refer to this as Incident 10 for the purposes of any hearing.
- 11.On 4<sup>th</sup> August 2018 at around 01:20 hours a female caller states she has been assaulted by the door staff at The Clock Tower. The female has been in the Clock Tower drinking when she has been approached by the door staff who have asked her to leave. The female has asked the door staff why and they have taken hold of her and dragged her out of the premise. No visible injury was caused but the female is left upset

- and distressed by the incident. The victim declined to follow up the incident with a statement. I will refer to this as Incident 11 for the purposes of any hearing.
- 12. On 29<sup>th</sup> September 2018 21:40 hours, at The Clock Tower, High Street, Stockton, two males are at the front remonstrating with door staff, who push them away. The two males become even more aggressive taking a swing at the door staff and picking up the barriers making up the smoking area at the front hitting the door staff with them. The door staff respond by taking the barriers off them and using them to hit and push the assailants with. The males back off but continue gesticulate and shadow box. This goes on for quite a good while until police turn up and the two males are arrested. This is an ongoing investigation. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/1. For the purpose of any hearing I will refer to this as Incident 12.
- 13. On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2018 at around 21:41 hours, a male leaves the premises with a bottle in his hand. One of the door staff approaches the male and tries to take it off him, but the male moves it out of his reach, the door staff try again but again the male makes to move past him towards the door with bottle. The door staff snatches the bottle from the male and pushes the male backwards, causing the male to fall backwards on to the pavement. The males gets back up upset and aggressive, but the situation is resolved by another male who appears to be with the first male. No call was made to police by the premise. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/2. For the purposes of the hearing I will refer to this as incident 13.
- 14.On Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2018 at around 7:14 pm, an adult male is refused service at the bar in The Clock Tower as they believed he was too drunk. The male has been going between this premise and a licensed premise next door drinking in both premises

well before he is refused service. After being refused service the male is escorted from the premise by the bar manager but on the way out picks up a jacket from the back of a chair. The jacket belonged to another male (I will refer to this male as male 2) who follows him out and confronts him. The male voluntarily hands the jacket back, the male 2 appears irate from the start. The footage shows Male 2 hit the male to the face causing the victim to fall backwards into the road, his head hitting the floor and he lays still. Male 2 puts on his jacket and runs off up the High Street. A male has been arrested and the investigation is ongoing. There is no phone call to police to report the incident at the time. Due to the seriousness of this incident the victim was in an induced coma for 11 days, he had a bleed on the brain and has a fractured skull. The victim was so poorly that a living post mortem was carried out. The victim is still in a serious condition in hospital and we have been told that there is still no way to predict how his injuries will affect him. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/2. The manager who escorted the male out was present throughout. Although calls were made to the ambulance service by members of the public who were present. No call was made to the Police about this incident by the manager or any other member of staff from the Clock Tower. For the purposes of the hearing I will refer to this as incident 14.

15.On Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2018 at around 01:36 hours, council CCTV picks up one of the door staff exiting the Clock Tower with a hold of an adult male. The door staff physically ejects the male throwing him into the street causing the male to fall to the floor. The male is clearly upset and becomes animated, gesticulating towards the door staff but leaves after a short while. No call was received from the premise to report this

incident to police. The incident is shown via CCTV footage on the evidence disc AT/2. For the purposes of the hearing I will refer to this as Incident 15.

All of these incidents have happened in the past 13 months, but it is worth mentioning that these are not the only reported incidents that the police have had reported involving the Clock Tower but they are the more serious ones.

We have also been forwarded drinks promotions which have been offered in the past by The Clock Tower. There are three promotions (which I have exhibited as Promotion 1, Promotion 2 and Promotion 3) which advertise drinks for £1, this appears to include Jagerbombs, bottles of Carlsberg, Tequila, Sambuca and Sours. Promotion 1 and Promotion 2 are for Thursday nights and clearly state this offer is on "All Night", Promotion 3 is for a Friday night and also states it is on "All Night". These three promotions selling alcohol at £1 all night seem to be purely to pull more people in using cheap alcohol promotions, but it can also be seen as condoning people consuming more for less.

The next promotion which I will refer to as Promotion 4 is a time sensitive offer between the hours of 2pm and 8pm and offers Buy One Get One Free (BOGOF) offer on bottles of Carlsberg, Single Vodka (with a mixer), Cactus Jack Shots and all cocktails on Sundays when Karaoke is on. This can only be seen as a promotion which is getting people to buy more alcohol than they would normally.

The next promotion which I will exhibit as Promotion 5 offers shots for £1 on Saturday nights from 7pm until 2am. Once again, another promotion with cheap alcohol to persuade people to come to the premise with the possibility of consuming more than would at normal drinks prices.

The next promotion which I will refer to as Promotion 6 states it is "All Day, Every Day!" and is for 3 bottles of Carlsberg for £5 which would make the bottles less than £1.70 each. This is another offer which makes it "better" for a person to buy 3 bottles of Carlsberg at once rather than buying them separately and spacing their drinks out. Coupled with the fact this is an "All Day" offer this could persuade people to drink more than would normally.

The final promotion, which I will refer to as Promotion 7, is a 2 for £5 "All Day, Every Day!" promotion on bottles of VK, Budweiser and Amigo. This would have the same affect as the previous promotion, getting people to buy two bottles at once and consume more than would normally.

We have tried to work with the premise and it's Premise Licence Holder and Designated Premise Supervisor Mr Andrew McAllister, but unfortunately the incidents have continued with one of the latest incidents (Incident 14) being particularly serious and leaving a man in hospital in a very serious condition. Reviews are always the last recourse of Cleveland Police and we have, unfortunately, reached the point where we have exhausted all other avenues.

1. On Sunday 30th December 2018 at around 02:00 hours, council CCTV captures an incident outside The Clock Tower which they report to police. CCTV footage shows a group outside the premise with door staff struggling to keep them apart. Three males in particular are being aggressive towards each other. Also present is a female in a green top, and from out of the venue comes a female dressed all in black. The three males continue to be aggressive towards each other and the door staff. One member of door staff grabs a male in a white and black t-shirt around the throat and drags him backwards then lets go of him.

The female in all black who earlier came out of the venue begins gesticulating at the group and the door staff further inflaming the situation. The three males run at each other with door staff trying to get between them. While this is going on a female in a red top and blue jeans has come out of the venue and she disappears from sight. Then one of the door staff runs towards the statue in the high street where we see him struggling to pull some fighting females apart. One is the female in the green top the other is the female in the red top with the blue jeans. While the door staff are trying to diffuse this situation another female in a white top with yellow bottoms kicks one of the females on the ground in the head, and is pushed away by the door staff. The police arrive and most of the group disperse. The male in the black and white t-shirt is detained by police. Although door staff initially made a complaint of assault they have since withdrawn their complaints and statements. I will refer to this as Incident 16.

2. On Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> January 2019 at around 00:45 hours, council CCTV picks up an incident. Two door staff are seen to lead a male out the premises and then appear to throw the male to the floor. The male is followed out by a long haired female who helps him to his feet. The female starts gesticulating and shouting and the door staff. The male and female move to the outside of the red barriers but the female continues to shout at the door staff. One of the door staff goes inside and removes his coat before coming back out. The male lashes out at the barriers knocking them over. The door staff right the barriers and confront the male, who spits at one of the door staff. Two door staff react angrily to this and go the other side of the barrier to confront the male. The long haired female pulls the male away and they walk off up the High Street. The incident was not reported until later by the female but the complaint was later withdrawn. I will refer to this as Incident 17.



### **Preliminary**

The Chair introduced all persons who were present and explained the procedure to be followed during the hearing. Mr Langley, on behalf of Cleveland Police, explained that discussions had taken place prior to the meeting between the Respondent and Mr Briggs and that the Respondent had consented to the transfer the Premise Licence to Cable Properties & Investments Ltd with immediate effect. The Committee were advised that the Respondent had signed the Consent Form, and on this basis, the Police had no objection to the transfer on completion of the paperwork. The Committee were, therefore, satisfied that pursuant to section 43 of The Licensing Act 2003, the transfer application could be given interim effect subject to the completion of the full application.

Mr Langley explained that the outstanding issue for the Committee was the Respondent's position as the Designated Premise Supervisor (DPS). Mr Langley submitted that the Committee ought to hear the evidence presented in respect of this in light of the seriousness of the incidents which prompted the application for a review. The Committee carefully considered these representations and resolved to hear the evidence in respect of the DPS issue.

#### Report to Committee

A copy of the report and supporting documents and statements had been provided to all persons present and to members of the Committee prior to the meeting.

#### Applicants' Submission

Mr Langley, on behalf of Cleveland Police, stated that the application for a review of the premises licence was prompted following a series of incidents reported since March 2013 at the premise known as The Funky Lime, 96 High Street, Stockton on Tees, ('the Premise').

The Committee were informed that Cleveland Police had worked with the Respondent and her then partner, Mr Hobbs, over this period in an attempt to prevent the undermining of the licensing objectives. Mr Langley submitted that there were suspected incidents of domestic violence between the Respondent and Mr Hobbs and, in March 2014, an Action Plan was put in place in an attempt to address the Police's concerns about the management of the premise. Whilst this had the desired effect in the short term, the situation deteriorated resulting in the Respondent being banned from licensed premises under the Stockton Pub Watch Scheme.

PC Johnson was called to give witness evidence on behalf of the Police in relation to the more serious incidents, which had been reported regarding the overall management of the premise. Members noted that, until the incident on 01 February 2014, Mr Hobbs was employed by the Respondent as the Manager at the premise. Following the incident, the Respondent demoted him to resident DJ. However, the association between the Respondent and Mr Hobbs, whether as friends or otherwise, continued throughout this.

PC Johnson detailed a number of issues including:-

JRJ/1

- 24 December 2013 Police Officers had been called to the premise in relation to a suspected incident of domestic violence (DV). On entering the premise, the Respondent was observed holding the side of her head and neck explaining to the Police Officers that she had had a verbal argument with her then partner, Mr Hobbs, about the opening and closing times of the premise. Mr Hobbs was drinking alcohol behind the bar when the Police arrived and insisted that it was 'nothing to do' with the Police. The Respondent insisted that she had fallen and bumped her head and asked the Police Officers not to approach Mr Hobbs as he would 'kick off'. Mr Hobbs was subsequently cautioned and arrested on suspicion of section 39 DV related common assault. However, as the Respondent and Mr Hobbs denied an assault had occurred, there were no independent witnesses and no CCTV footage, no further action could be taken.
- 17 and 20 January 2014 PC Johnson described an incident where Mr Hobbs had assaulted a male in the Premise on 17 January 2014. The allegation was that Mr Hobbs had pulled the male across the bar and attacked him. In the scuffle, the male's wife had sustained a broken leg. At the identity parade which later took place, Mr Hobbs was identified by the male but not his wife so no further action could be taken in respect of his wife's injury. The male later informed the Police that he did not wish to pursue his complaint and refused to co-operate with the Police. Although the police were unable to take any further action in respect of this matter, the Committee were referred to a copy an email from the PC who attended at the incident on 18 January 2014. Mr Hobbs was described as being very aggressive and coming close to being arrested. It was also recorded that the Respondent did not "co-operate with the police".
- 01 February 2014 Having received a report from members of the public regarding an incident inside the premise, Police Officers responded. Upon arrival, Mr Hobbs was observed picking up chairs and smashing them down on the floor. The whole area was "littered with bits of wood and broken glass" and "there were a number of smashed chairs and tables on the floor along with smashed drinks glasses". Mr Hobbs became very aggressive stating, "you're not putting handcuffs on me, you are not getting me out of here". CS spray was discharged in order to restrain Mr Hobbs and the professional opinion of Police Officers was that Mr Hobbs was intoxicated. In response to this incident, the Respondent told police that he would not be working Fridays and Saturdays she made no mention that Mr Hobbs would be demoted from manager to DJ.
- 15 February 2014 The Committee observed the CCTV footage showing a sequence of events on Stockton High Street which culminated in Mr Hobbs assaulting a drunken male who attempted to enter the Respondent's premise and apparently knocking him unconscious. The Committee were particularly concerned about this incident as Mr Hobbs was employed as a DJ not a doorman. He had received no training as doorman, and when questioned where the door staff were, the Respondent stated: "I couldn't tell you where they were". This incident resulted in the Respondent being asked to enter into an agreed action plan. This was initially refused when PC Johnson attended the premise on 20 February 2014 because the Respondent disagreed with comments made about the supply of CCTV footage. The Respondent and Mr Hobbs did, however, subsequently sign it on 07 March 2014 having viewed the CCTV footage of the incident on 15 February 2014.
- 04 May 2014 The Respondent reported an incident to Cleveland Police alleging that both she and Mr Hobbs were assaulted by a male and female on Stockton High Street. As a result, the male and female in question were put on Pub Watch and banned from licensed premises for 3 months. The Chair of Pub Watch subsequently contacted Cleveland Police with CCTV footage which was shown to Members during the meeting. The Respondent could be seen 'brawling' on the floor with the other female, and it was evident that the Respondent and Mr Hobbs had provoked the incident. The three month ban in respect of the male and female was immediately quashed by Pub Watch on viewing this footage.

- 10 June 2014 The Committee heard an audio recording of a telephone message left by Mr Hobbs on the answer machine of The Swan Public House in Billingham relating to the premises, 'Goldies' on Stockton High Street. The Committee noted, however, that the Respondent had no apparent involvement in this other than the fact that Mr Hobbs is her friend and was purporting to speak as someone with an interest in the Respondent's premise.
- 15 August 2014 The Respondent made inappropriate comments on Facebook about The Garrick Public House which had recently employed the services of a new door company. The Respondent's comments were provocative in nature and included: "Everyone get yourself to The Garrick, new door staff public insurance out of date, all barred welcome". These comments were seen to encourage unsavoury characters to this establishment and implied that the Public Liability insurance was out of date. These comments were clearly accessible by the general public and were not considered responsible or appropriate comments by the holder of a Premise Licence/DPS
- 09 September 2014 The actions of the Respondent and Mr Hobbs were considered so serious by members of Pubwatch that they unanimously voted to exclude The Funky Lime from membership of the group.
- 24 September 2014 The owner of the door company supplying door staff to The Garrick reported receipt of an abusive voice message from Mr Hobbs making threats of a sexual nature in relation to his wife. Again, however, the Committee noted that the Respondent had no apparent involvement in this other than the fact that Mr Hobbs is her friend and was purporting to speak as someone with an interest in the Respondent's premise.
- O3 October 2014 The Committee observed two recordings of CCTV footage. The first recording showed two members of staff from Goldies Public House, one of which was on stilts, walking along Stockton High Street handing flyers out. On approaching the Respondent's premise, the Respondent could be seen pushing the female not on stilts, and gesticulating at two males who had been talking to them. On the second recording, the Respondent and Mr Hobbs were observed acting in an intimidating manner towards a male stood outside Goldies Public House. The male in question was the owner of the door company who supplies door staff to this public house. Members observed the Respondent 'finger wagging' at the male. Mr Hobbs was then seen to approach him. Mr Hobbs was pushed away but then returned several times, staring in an intimidating manner. The Respondent and Mr Hobbs were issued separately with Harassment Notices in relation to their respective behaviour on 03 October 2014.

The Respondent was invited to ask questions of PC Johnson after each incident was described.

### Respondent's Submission

The Respondent dismissed the evidence generally as a 'pack of lies'. The most salient points of the Respondent's case are summarised below:

- In relation to the incident on 24 December 2014, the Respondent was of the view that
  the argument between herself and Mr Hobbs was her fault and she did not make a
  'complaint' to the police. Mr Hobbs did not assault her; an 'A' board had fallen on her
  head and he was simply helping her up.
- In relation to the incident on 17 January 2014, the Respondent disputed that the female in question had broken her leg, and that as she was dancing in 'Goldies' public house two hours later. The Respondent also implied that Mr Hobbs was acting in defence of her as the male in question had his hands around her throat and she believed he was attempting to take her life though she did not make a complaint to the police to this effect or at all.

- In relation to the incident on 01 February 2014, Mr Hobbs, who was the Respondent's Manager at the time, admitted he had anger problems and had 'lost the plot' though he denied being intoxicated and disputed that a high volume of CS gas had been used to restrain him. Mr Hobbs did not believe that he had done anything wrong in terms of the damage to property as it was 'his' property. The Respondent accepted that this was not appropriate behaviour for a manager and informed the Committee that she had demoted him to the position of DJ following this incident. The Respondent was of the view that Mr Hobbs actions were her fault as she 'drove him to it'.
- In relation to the incident on 15 February 2014, the Respondent and Mr Hobbs claimed that the drunken male was the aggressor, and that Mr Hobbs' action in assaulting him and apparently knocking him unconscious was self-defence. Mr Hobbs informed Members that he believed the male had an object in the bag which caused him to fear for his safety. The Respondent also alleged that the male was very aggressive (although she did not witness the incident herself) and stated that Mr Hobbs believed that the bag he was carrying looked distinctly heavier after leaving Stephensons', the public house next door, and attempting to enter the Respondent's premise.
- In relation to the threatening and abusive voice messages left by Mr Hobbs on 10 June 2014 and 24 September 2014, the Respondent was of the view that these had 'nothing to do with' her though the Police queried why Mr Hobbs had referred to her as his 'partner'.
- In relation to the incident on 15 August 2014, the Respondent believed that her comments on Facebook were justified and she could not understand why they would be considered inappropriate for a premise Licence holder/DPS.
- In relation to the CCTV recordings on 03 October 2014, the Respondent was of the view that she was provoked into pushing the member of staff from Goldies Public House as she had asked them not to 'fly' outside the premise due to the amount of litter. The Respondent also questioned the insurances held by Goldies in relation to the other member of staff on stilts, though this was considered irrelevant to the matter before the Committee. In response to the CCTV footage showing the Respondent and Mr Hobbs acting in intimidating way towards the owner of the door company, the Respondent and Mr Hobbs were unable to explain why they acted in the manner they did, other than the fact that the male had parked his car outside and they believed he had 'no business' being there.

#### Members Decision Making

Members had regard to the bundle of written evidence which had been circulated prior to the hearing and presented to them, in addition to the oral evidence given and submissions made at the hearing. The Committee also had regard to the statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Committee were careful to distinguish the incidents in which the Respondent stated she had no control. In particular, the abusive and threatening voice messages left on 10 June 2014 and 24 September 2014.

After carefully considering the written and oral evidence in relation to the Respondent, the Committee expressed very real concerns about the Respondent's apparent failure to recognise how her actions could be considered responsible actions of a DPS. The Committee were also concerned about the Respondent's continued association with Mr Hobbs and her apparent failure to acknowledge how this undermined the licensing objectives. On balance, the Committee were satisfied that the incidents described were fundamentally linked to the overall control and management of the premise for which the Respondent is responsible as DPS. The Committee were also satisfied that the Police had made every

effort to work with the Respondent to address the problems and ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives. However, the Committee unanimously felt that the fundamental cause of the problems at the premise was the involvement of Miss Poppleton as the DPS. The Committee were in no doubt that, had the Premise Licence not been transferred, members would have revoked it based on the evidence presented.

The Committee, therefore, resolved that the most appropriate step in the circumstances was to remove Miss Poppleton as the Designated Premise Supervisor in order to promote the licensing objectives pursuant to section 52(4)(c) of the Licensing Act 2003. This was deemed to be proportionate given the seriousness of the incidents at the premise, which included persistent and inappropriate behaviour by the Respondent

The Committee balanced their decision to remove the Respondent as the DPS against the potential financial/social impact on her. However, the evidence presented by the Police was so compelling that the Committee were satisfied that her removal as DPS was deemed to be a proportionate response.

After giving consideration to all of the evidence both written and oral in this matter, the Committee therefore resolved:-

To remove the Respondent as the Designated Premise Supervisor

Any person aggrieved by this decision may appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of receipt of this letter. Anyone considering whether to submit an appeal is advised to seek their own independent legal advice as the Magistrates Court has the power to award costs against unsuccessful appellants. A copy of this letter should be taken to the Magistrates Court should an aggrieved person wish to submit an appeal.

This decision will take effect on the day following the expiration of the 21 day period given for submitting a statutory appeal.

Dear All,

It was nice to meet everybody today. We thought the meeting was very practical, and we appreciated the sharing of information. I am writing to confirm a list of action points to be taken:

1. Remove the shelf unit located in the foyer, which has been used for customers glasses/drinks. This is subject to review, and we will see how this works.

ACTION: Done.

2. Whilst metal detectors ("wands") are used at the premises, the Police would like this to be a little more visual. So, a wand will be kept on the door when security is in operation, where it can be seen. There will also be a poster up outside notifying customers of its use and the random search policy.

ACTION: 1 week.

3. A drug box will be sourced. There isn't currently a drug issue at the premises (no more than any other premises) and there are policies in place, but an increase in search activity may result in drug confiscations. There will be a log to go along with the box.

ACTION: As soon as we can get a drug box.

- 4. We have agreed to, and have already actioned, an increase in drinks prices. This was predominantly as a reaction to issues Jokers are experiencing, and to dissuade its customers frequenting our premises should their hours be cut. ACTION: Done.
- 5. Bodycams are to be sourced for use at the premises. We are already operating with two, but the little outdated and we will look to source to newer units. This will assist in evidence gathering in the premises and on the door.

ACTION: As soon as the equipment can be sourced.

6. We will be running our fourth 'Clubber Land' night in December. Unlike the previous three events (two of which operated without issue) we will not seek to increase our hours to 4am in this instance. Instead, we will operate until 02:00. Following this event, we will review with the Police whether there have been any issues prior to applying for any further TEN's.

ACTION: Andy McAllister to speak to Jimmy or Paul following 2<sup>nd</sup> Dec event.

7. We will install a CCTV camera on the left hand side of the premises (already have one on the right hand side), to cover that part of the premises.

ACTION: 1 week.

8. We will carry out a general risk assessment to see whether any further improvements we can make at the premises.

ACTION: 1 week for assessment with separate time line for any further action points identified. Andy McAllister to liaise on those further points.

9. The premises licence holder is going to apply online to impose Pubwatch bans on individuals involved in incidents on 30<sup>th</sup> Sept, 11<sup>th</sup> Oct and 13<sup>th</sup> Oct.

ACTION: Premises to apply to ban individuals and Jimmy to provide names at next Pubwatch meeting, where a representative of the premises will attend.

10. The Police are going to provide two officers to cover Friday and Saturday nights. This has been agreed with the neighbourhood Inspector and in consultation with the head of the council, Neil Schneider. The officers will be there to cover Stockton High Street, Norton High Street and Yarm High Street. It is believed that they will be based on Stockton High Street, moving to other locations when received

ACTION: Paul Higgins to confin

e APEX radio scheme. The two late night premises nearby, Goldies and Dr M's are adio so they can als pom and other nearby premises.

ACTION: Jimmy to speak to those operators, push for radio use will also be made at the next Pubwatch meeting.

Glassing on 30th Sept.

Following our meeting today we spoke with and Darbyshire (Head Doorman) regarding the alleged glassing in the foyer. We reviewed the footage frame by frame and could not see a bottle or glass although clearly an individual motions towards the injured party. And Darbyshire is adamant the glassing took place further down the street. He says this because he was there at the time, commented on the blood present in anther location and that there was no blood by our premises. He also states that it was the doormen at Goldies who administered first aid to the injured party. If the CCTV is of assistance it might be worth taking a look at the footage and perhaps speaking with the Darbyshire and the door team from Goldies. They may be able to assist in either identifying the attacker or the location. Andy McAllister can provide contact details.



### MANDATORY CONDITIONS AND EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS

### MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- This Licence/Club Registration Certificate is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:-

The Children and Young Person Act 1933
The Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
The Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985

- When door supervisors or other persons carrying out security activities at specified times are employed such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
  - For the purposes of this condition "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 applies.
- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
      - (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2)The designated premise supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- The responsible person must ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
    - (i) beer or cider:1/2 pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky:25ml or 35ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass:125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

- A. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
  - B. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph A -
    - (a) "duty" is to construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
    - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P=D+(DxV)

Where-

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premise supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- C. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph B would (apart from this paragraph)not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny
- D. (1)Sub-paragraph(2)applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph B on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### **EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS**

On Licences
 Permitted Hours

The restriction on the permitted hours for the supply of alcohol shall not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after these hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (b) during the first thirty minutes after these hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (c) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- That the Licensee will implement any drugs policy approved and promoted by Stockton Police.
- The maximum permitted occupancy level in the front and back bar (with movable chairs and tables removed) shall be 320.
- This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restriction imposed on the existing licence of the premises:

For the showing of films under the provisions of the Cinemas Act 1985

and/or

The performance of plays under the Theatres Act 1968

and/or

The provision of public entertainment under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1982) as below;

- 3. Special Conditions
- 3.1 All doors and windows shall be kept closed whilst entertainment is in progress.
- 3.2 During an event, the licensee (or suitable representative) shall make subjective assessments, both internally and externally, of the likelihood of noise disturbance being caused by the entertainment. The result of these assessments shall be recorded in a log book, including any action required as a result, which shall be retained for one year.
- 3.3 Twenty-eight days notice prior to any sporting event, accompanied by details of the event with plans, if necessary, indicating the floor area required for the event and proposed seating arrangements.

### **ANNEX 2**

### CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

### PREVENTION OF CRIME & DISORDER

- No person in possession of a drink in a sealed or unsealed container shall be allowed to enter the premises except for the purposes of delivery.
- Ensure sight of evidence of age from any person appearing to those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol.
- There shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises a sign, which
  is clearly visible to members of the public visiting those premises
  containing details of the trading hours under the premises licence,
  the licensable activities permitted on those premises and any maximum
  occupancy level set for the premises.
- The licence holder and/or the Designated Premises Supervisor or a person nominated by them shall actively participate and be a member of a Pubwatch scheme for the area within which the premises is located.
- CCTV cameras shall be maintained in the premises and tapes/records kept a minimum of 31 days and shall be available for inspection by the Police/Licensing Authority on request.
- No irresponsible sales promotions of alcoholic beverages shall be offered to customers.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

- Printed notices shall be prominently displayed in the premises detailing the essential steps that must be taken if a fire is discovered or the fire alarm goes off or other emergency arises and how to call the Fire Service.
- All fire doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices.

### PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

 Notices shall be erected at all exits from the premises, in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly and with consideration to neighbours.

### PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

 Up to 9pm children under the age of 18 years shall be allowed in the premise when accompanied by a parent or guardian. No children under 18 years will be allowed in the premise beyond 9pm.
