ALITHEO'S BAR, 391-393 NORTON ROAD, NORTON, STOCKTON-ON-TEES TS20 2QQ

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to determine an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to which there has been representations from Responsible Authorities.

RECOMMENDATION

That Members determine the application.

THE APPLICATION

1. An application for a variation has been received from Mr Peter Charlton in relation to Alitheo's Bar, 391-393 Norton Road, Norton, Stockton-On-Tees TS20 2QQ. The proposed variation is to include the upstairs area of the premises and to remove the following condition on Annex 3 of the premise licence under the heading of Prevention of Public Nuisance and as part of the embedded restrictions at point 3.5:

"Regulated entertainment shall be provided no more than three occasions in any week".

"No more than three events shall be held in any seven day period".

A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1.

A copy of the existing licence is attached at Appendix 2 for information.

RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

2. Representations have been received from Cleveland Fire Brigade and Environmental Health. These representations relate to Public Safety and the prevention of Public Nuisance. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 3 & Appendix 4

Cleveland Police have received agreed conditions signed by the applicant which will be added to the operating schedule. A copy is attached at Appendix 5.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT	

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In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

ANNEX 1

MANDATORY CONDITIONS AND EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- This Licence/Club Registration Certificate is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:-

The Children and Young Person Act 1933
The Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
The Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise

- anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premise supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider:1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky:25ml or 35ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass:125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- A. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
 - B. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph A -
 - (a) "duty" is to construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P=D+(DxV)

Where-

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premise supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- C. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph B would (apart from this paragraph)not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny
- D. (1)Sub-paragraph(2)applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph B on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS

On Licences
Permitted Hours

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- (a) On Weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve. 11.00am to 11.00pm.
- (b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 Noon to 10.30pm.
- (c) On Good Friday, 12 Noon to 10.30pm
- (d) On Christmas Day, 12 Noon to 3.00pm and 7.00pm to 10.30pm
- (e) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11.00am to 11.00pm
- (f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 Noon to 10.30pm
- (g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after these hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after these hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after these hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restriction imposed on the existing licence of the premises:

For the showing of films under the provisions of the Cinemas Act 1985

and/or

The performance of plays under the Theatres Act 1968

and/or

The provision of public entertainment under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1982) as below;

- 1. Permitted Hours Of Operation
 11.00am 12Midnight Monday Saturday
 12Noon 11.30pm Sunday
 - 2. Maximum Permitted Occupancy Level Whole Premises 60
 - 3. Special Conditions
 - 3.1 All doors and windows shall be kept closed whilst entertainment is in progress
 - 3.2 During an event, the licensee (or a suitable representative) shall make subjective assessments, both internally and externally, of the likelihood of noise disturbance being caused by entertainment. The results of these assessments shall be recorded in a logbook including any action required as a result, which shall be retained for one year.
 - 3.3 The licensee or nominated person shall take all reasonable steps to prevent disturbance or nuisance by persons leaving the premises and shall undertake such monitoring, if any, in this respect, as may be required by the Council.
 - 3.4 A sign shall be erected at all exits asking patrons to leave the premises in a quiet manner and to consider the occupiers of nearby dwellings.
 - 3.5 No more than three events shall be held in any seven day period.
 - 3.6 The access door to the beer garden at the rear shall not be used whilst a public entertainment event is occurring.

ANNEX 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

PREVENTION OF CRIME & DISORDER

- No drink shall be removed from the premises in an unsealed container.
- The maximum number of persons allowed in these premises shall be (80 persons).
- The Licensee shall not supply alcoholic drinks at a "reduced price" during any limited period on any day.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- There shall be maintained on the premises at all times an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials.
- At all times when the public are present, at least one person who
 holds a current recognised first aid certificate or award shall be
 present on the premises. Where more than one such person is present
 their duties shall be clearly defined.
- Emergency lighting, including iluminated exit signs, the fire alarm system and fire fighting equipment shall be maintained in satisfactory working order.

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

 Window shutters shall be closed after 23.00 when regulated entertainment is taking place.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

Persons under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult over 21 years of age when on the premises.


PREVENTION OF CRIME & DISORDER

Customers shall not be allowed to enter the premises after 23.00.

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency.
 Any music played within the premises shall not cause a disturbance at the nearest premises. Any music shall be played indoors only.
- The licence holder or his representative shall conduct periodic assessments of the noise coming from the premises when used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action. All records shall be retained for one year.
- Use appropriate management controls to reduce the likelihood of customers causing noise disturbance to local residents when vacating the premises. This should include placing at all exits from the premises, in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly. (Note, this may also include a reference to vehicles)
- Entry into the beer garden by customers shall cease at 23.00. All
 customers to have vacated the beer garden by 23.20. There shall be no
 music played in the beer garden and no use of flood lighting likely to
 cause a nuisance to local residential properties.
- Regulated entertainment shall be provided no more than three occasions in any week.

Environmental Health are of the opinion that this premises is not currently suitable for the Licensable activities they are applying for, the premises has external metal stair cases, which the Fire Brigade have made Representation to and a single door for customers to access the premises which will allow significant noise outbreak to disturb the very close residential premises to the rear.

Officers have visited the premises to discuss options with the applicant to see if there are any conditions that could be agreed to ensure that no disturbances were created but as the premises stands in its current state there would be no option other than to recommend the following conditions

- No music, Live or amplified, shall be played in the 1st floor sports bar.
- Refuse such as bottles shall be disposed of from the premises at a time when it is not likely to cause a disturbance to residents in the vicinity of the premises.

That said however, this condition would not abate the noise of customers accessing the premises on the metal staircase and being in very close proximity to the bedroom of the residential property.

It would be the professional opinion of Environmental Health that this issue could be solved by the total enclosure of the stair case, however, additional planning permission will be required and the specifications of the enclosure will need to comply with both Fire Safety and Noise Mitigation.

Following my discussions with Cleveland Police concerning the above premises. I confirm that I wish to amend my operating schedule to include the following:

1, A digital Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped.

The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard-drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with Data Protection legislation.

CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of **evidential quality** in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.

Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

There will be a minimum of 31 days recording.

The system will record for 24 hours a day.

The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any desktop computer.

The Digital recorder will have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images.

There will be at all times a member of staff who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from a governing body, such as Cleveland Police or any other Responsible Authority, be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time, e.g. 24hrs routine or less if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.

- 2, Alcohol shall not be removed from the designated licensed area in open containers.
- 3, All staff will be fully trained and the training must include the laws relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons, persons buying on behalf of under 18s (proxy sales), persons

appearing to be under the influence of alcohol and also the operation of the associated 'Challenge 25' policy. Staff will receive refresher training at least every 6 months.

- 4, Training records, signed by both the staff member and the Designated Premise Supervisor/Store Manager/Business Owner will be retained for future reference and shall be updated at least every 6 months. All staff training records will be made available to the Licensing Authority and/or Responsible Authorities upon request.
- 5, The business will maintain an incident book to record all instances where the staff deal with people who have been unruly, drunk, abusive, aggressive or have committed criminal acts or have had to call police for such incidents. This shall include the date and time of the incident, together with a description of the incident and whether the police were called/attended. The Designated Premise Supervisor/Store Manager/Business Owner will check and sign each page and the incident book will be made available to the Licensing Authority and/or Responsible Authorities upon request.
- 6, There will be a minimum of two notices displayed on the premise indicating that the sale of alcohol to those under the age of 18 is illegal and that those adults who buy alcohol for immediate disposal to those under age the age of 18 are committing an offence.
- 7, Children under the age of 18 years shall be accompanied by a responsible parent/guardian. Children will not be allowed at the bar or to remain in the premises beyond 21:00 hours.

If my application is successful, I understand that these amendments will then form part of any conditions attached to the grant of the licence.
