LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A PREMISE LICENCE THE HARDWICK, 2 HIGH NEWHAM ROAD, STOCKTON-ON-TEES, TS19 8RQ

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to determine an application for the grant of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to which there have been representations from Responsible Authorities, Local Residents and a Local Councillor.

RECOMMENDATION

That Members determine the application.

THE APPLICATION

- 1. An application for the grant of a premise licence has been received from Mr Craig Robinson, in relation to The Hardwick, 2 High Newham Road, Stockton-On-Tees. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2. A map and photo's showing the location of the premises, the old Simply Drinks unit, is attached as Appendix 2.

RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

- 3. Cleveland Police have agreed conditions with the applicant, these are attached at Appendix 3.
- 4. A representation was received from the Local Councillor on the grounds of the Prevention of Crime & Disorder, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm and Public Safety, which is attached at Appendix 4.
- 5. A representation was received from Environmental Health and conditions were agreed, and the representation was withdrawn. The agreed conditions attached at Appendix 5.
- 6. A representation was received from Planning on the ground of Public Nuisance and is attached at Appendix 6.
- 7. Representations from local residents have been received and are attached as Appendix 7.

POLICY CONSIDERATION

8. Members are respectfully reminded of the need to give due consideration to Stockton Borough Councils Licensing Policy Statement and Section 182 Revised Guidance issued on April 2018 under the Licensing Act 2003 when determining this application.

Paragraph 41 of the Council Policy states:

'The Council recommends that applicants risk assess their operation against the four licensing objectives to identify potential areas of concern. An operating schedule should include

information which is necessary to enable any responsible authority or other person to assess whether the steps to be taken to promote the licensing objectives are satisfactory.'

- 9. Members must carry out their functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm

- 10. Members may consider the following options:
 - 1. To refuse the application.
 - 2. To grant all or part of the application subject to the necessary conditions to promote the four licensing objectives.
