As a Ward Councillor for Hardwick & Salters Lane, I have been contacted by a number of residents who live near to 2 High Newham Road and who have serious concerns about the opening of a licensed drinking establishment in close proximity to to residential properties.

Having now had the opportunity to study the application and take soundings from those I represent, I now wish to object on the following grounds.

PREVENTION OF CRIME & DISORDER

This area of Hardwick already has more than its fair share of anti social behaviour & reported crime. I believe as do residents that opening a licensed premises at this location, will likely increase the probability of anti social behaviour.

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- ▶ I note from the application that the applicant is wishing to play recorded music, 7 days a week from 11.00hrs 00.00hrs. I have significants concerns with regards to noise interrupting the peace & quite that those living in homes just a few feet away will have to endure. I note from the operating schedule that the applicant is wishing to serve alcohol both inside the premises and outside the premises, in the designated beer garden which is in close proximity to family homes. I fail to see, with patrons coming in and out of the premises how it will be possible to contain the noise of the recorded music within the premises.
- With patrons drinking & socialising in groups outside of the premises, I also have concerns that groups talking & laughing etc will constitute a nuisance to those living near by.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM.

- I believe that patrons smoking in the beer garden & designated smoking shelter will pose a real risk from passive smoking to the health & well being of children living close to the remises and also children waking close by on their way to local shops and schools. The pavement to the front of the premises is just a few feet wide, bordered on onside my the beer garden & smoking shelter and on the other side by railings, thus making it almost impossible to avoid creating in smoke from patrons.
- I also believe that the noise produced from the bar which will operate up until midnight 7 days a week will also likely have an impact on the health & wellbeing of children living nearby.

PUBLIC SAFTEY.

Given the lack of parking and that fact that there is no legal drop off area to the front or side of the premises, I have genuine concerns that taxis & cars will pull up on the corner of High Newham Road & Scurfield Road, thus blocking busses, ambulances & other traffic. I feel this presents a real risk to public safety.
