REPORT TO THE STATUTORY LICENSING COMMITTEE

LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A PREMISE LICENCE 7ELEVEN LOCAL, 48 DURHAM ROAD, STOCKTON-ON-TEES TS19 0BS

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to determine an application for the grant of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to which there have been representations from Ward Councillors and local residents.

RECOMMENDATION

That Members determine the application.

THE APPLICATION

1. An application for grant of a premise licence has been received from Mr Fahad Anwar, in relation to 7eleven Local, 48 Durham Road, Stockton-On-Tees.

The applicant has applied for a licence for the following:

Supply of Alcohol Off The Premises

Monday to Sunday 08.00 – 22.00

Opening Hours

Monday to Sunday 08.00 – 22.00

A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1.

RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

2. Environmental Health and Cleveland Police have received agreed conditions signed by the applicant which will be added to the operating schedule. Copies are attached at Appendix 2 & 3.

INTERESTED PARTIES

3. A number of representations have been received from Ward Councillors and Interested Parties. These representations relate to the prevention of Crime & Disorder, Public Nuisance and Public Safety objectives. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 4.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

4. After discussion with the applicant on the Councils current Statement of Licensing Policy, the applicant amended the supply alcohol hours to Monday to Sunday 09:00 – 22:00.
5. Attached at Appendix 5 is a map showing the location of the premises.

POLICY CONSIDERATION

6. Members are respectfully reminded of the need to give due consideration to Stockton Borough Councils Licensing Policy Statement and Section 182 Revised Guidance issued on April 2018 under the Licensing Act 2003 when determining this application.

Paragraph 41 of the Council Policy states:

'The Council recommends that applicants risk assess their operation against the four licensing objectives to identify potential areas of concern. An operating schedule should include information which is necessary to enable any responsible authority or other person to assess whether the steps to be taken to promote the licensing objectives are satisfactory.'

Paragraph 132 of the Council Policy states:

'Shops, stores and supermarkets will in general be licensed to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any time when the retail outlet is open for shopping but new or variation applications requesting that the sale of alcohol starts before 9.00am or finishes after 10.00pm in residential areas will generally be refused. In addition, new or variation applications for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises before 9.00am or after 11.30pm (12 midnight on a Friday and Saturday night) in residential areas will normally be refused.'

7. Members must carry out their functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:
- The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm

MEMBERS OPTIONS

8. Members may consider the following options:
1. To refuse the application.
 2. To grant all or part of the application subject to the necessary conditions to promote the four licensing objectives.
