<p>I object to live music being played at the premises between the hours of 9am and 11pm:</p> <p>We can already hear noise from the Beckfields shops and pub from our property, and this will only add to the problem.</p> <p>I understand planning was granted for this restaurant on the basis that the amenities of nearby residents would be protected and that no amplified music would be permitted. If this is a restaurant and not a pub, why the need for live musicians?</p> <p>Once a licence to play live music is granted the premises will be able to do as they wish, what is to stop them having DJs and rock band playing in the bistro? Everyone in the neighbourhood will suffer disturbance.</p> <p>I am also concerned that live music will attract a younger crowd more suited to Yarm High Street, than a restaurant would, with the associated anti-social behaviour on an evening (drunkenness, noise on leaving the premises late at night, etc).</p>
