- All staff who have direct dealings with customers shall be trained in the following:

- a) Persons appearing to be under the influence of alcohol/drugs
- b) The challenge 25 policy
- c) The premises licence and its conditions

A record shall be kept of this training which will be refreshed no less than every 6 months and this record shall be available for inspection by the licensing authority or police upon request.

#### Prevention of crime and disorder

- An incident and refusals log ('the log') will be kept and maintained at the premises and all incidents and refusals of sales of alcohol shall be recorded in it. As a minimum, the log will record the date and time of the incident/ refusal, the name of the person making the entry, the nature of the incident/ refusal and any actions taken.

- The DPS/ manager will undertake a risk assessment in relation to any night where regulated entertainment is to be provided at the premises past 23.00 hours in order to determine whether SIA door staff will be required to promote the licensing objectives. Where the risk assessment identifies the need for SIA door staff, these will be provided at the times and in the numbers deemed by the risk assessment to be appropriate in the circumstances. This risk assessment can be undertaken once in relation to a series of nights where the same entertainment is to be provided (for instance, regular Friday night discos), so long as it is revisited regularly to ensure that the risk assessment remains appropriate for that night. The risk assessment is to be in written form and kept at the premises for at least 30 days after the night or series of nights to which it relates.

- The DPS or suitably nominated colleague to regularly attend Pubwatch or other similar scheme.

- A zero tolerance policy towards illegal drugs shall be enforced at all times.

- A digital Closed Circuit Television system (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped.

- The CCTV system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with data protection legislation. CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.

- Camera will cover all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

- CCTV will hold recordings for 28 days.

- The system will have a minimum of a simplex multiplexing facility and be recording for 24 hours a day.

- The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be plated back on any desktop.

- The digital recorder will have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tempering, or deletion of images.

- There will at all times be a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from a governing body, such as Cleveland Police or any other Responsible Authority, be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time, eg 24hrs routine or less if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.

- In the event of a technical failure of the CCTV equipment the rpemises licence holder/ DOS must report the failure to Police.

#### **Public safety**

- The DPS/ manager will undertake a weekly inspection of the public areas of the premises to identify anything might present an identifiable risk to public safety. Any risks identified that are deemed to be unreasonable must be rectified at the earliest possible opportunity.

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

- A sign will be displayed at each exit from the premises asking customers to respect the rights of nearby residents not to be disturbed.

- Any outside areas are to be monitored and supervised by management and staff, when occupied, during the hours that the premises are open to the public.

- No sale of alcohol in the external areas will take place after 22.30 hours.

- When regulated entertainment is provided at the premises, noise checks will be carried out at the nearest noise sensitive property. A noise check log of these checks will be kept and maintained at the premises. As a minimum the log will record the date and time of the check, the name of the person making the check, the sound level and if required any action taken. The log will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

- The use of the beer garden by customers shall be limited from 09.00 hours until 22.30 hours (except for bank holiday weekends to 23.30).

- No bottles shall be emptied into the external bins after the premises have closed to the public.

- All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is provided, except for access and egress or in case of an emergency.

#### Protection of children from harm

- Children under 16 must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.

- A challenge 25 policy will be operated at the premises. There shall be sufficient public notices displayed at the premises advising customers of the policy in place.

Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
  - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
    - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance

on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

To extend the supply of alcohol and recorded music on Friday and Saturday until 00.30 hours the following morning (currently permitted until 00.00 hours).

To extend late night refreshment on Friday and Saturday until 00.30 hours the following morning (currently permitted until 00.00 hours).

To extend the opening hours of the premises on Friday and Saturday until 01.00 hours the following morning (currently permitted until 00.30 hours).

To licence the external area for the sale of alcohol.

To remove all the current conditions from the premises licence and replace with the following:

# General

- All staff who have direct dealings with customers shall be trained in the following:

- a) Persons appearing to be under the influence of alcohol/drugs
- b) The challenge 25 policy
- c) The premises licence and its conditions

A record shall be kept of this training which will be refreshed no less than every 6 months and this record shall be available for inspection by the licensing authority or police upon request.

#### Prevention of crime and disorder

- An incident and refusals log ('the log') will be kept and maintained at the premises and all incidents and refusals of sales of alcohol shall be recorded in it. As a minimum, the log will record the date and time of the incident/ refusal, the name of the person making the entry, the nature of the incident/ refusal and any actions taken.

- The DPS/ manager will undertake a risk assessment in relation to any night where regulated entertainment is to be provided at the premises past 23.00 hours in order to determine whether SIA door staff will be required to promote the licensing objectives. Where the risk assessment identifies the need for SIA door staff, these will be provided at the times and in the numbers deemed by the risk assessment to be appropriate in the circumstances. This risk assessment can be undertaken once in relation to a series of nights where the same entertainment is to be provided (for instance, regular Friday night discos), so long as it is revisited regularly to ensure that the risk assessment remains appropriate for that night. The risk assessment is to be in written form and kept at the premises for at least 30 days after the night or series of nights to which it relates.

- The DPS or suitably nominated colleague to regularly attend Pubwatch or other similar scheme.

- A zero tolerance policy towards illegal drugs shall be enforced at all times.

- A digital Closed Circuit Television system (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped.

- The CCTV system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed, whilst complying with data protection legislation. CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.

- Camera will cover all ingress and egress to the premises, outside areas and all areas where sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

- CCTV will hold recordings for 28 days.

- The system will have a minimum of a simplex multiplexing facility and be recording for 24 hours a day.

- The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be plated back on any desktop.

- The digital recorder will have the facility to be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tempering, or deletion of images.

- There will at all times be a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of the equipment and upon receipt of a request for footage from a governing body, such as Cleveland Police or any other Responsible Authority, be able to produce the footage within a reasonable time, eg 24hrs routine or less if urgently required for investigation of serious crime.

- In the event of a technical failure of the CCTV equipment the rpemises licence holder/ DOS must report the failure to Police.

# **Public safety**

- The DPS/ manager will undertake a weekly inspection of the public areas of the premises to identify anything might present an identifiable risk to public safety. Any risks identified that are deemed to be unreasonable must be rectified at the earliest possible opportunity.

# **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

- A sign will be displayed at each exit from the premises asking customers to respect the rights of nearby residents not to be disturbed.

- Any outside areas are to be monitored and supervised by management and staff, when occupied, during the hours that the premises are open to the public.

- No sale of alcohol in the external areas will take place after 22.30 hours.

- When regulated entertainment is provided at the premises, noise checks will be carried out at the nearest noise sensitive property. A noise check log of these checks will be kept and maintained at the premises. As a minimum the log will record the date and time of the check, the name of the person making the check, the sound level and if required any action taken. The log will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

- The use of the beer garden by customers shall be limited from 09.00 hours until 22.30 hours (except for bank holiday weekends to 23.30).

- No bottles shall be emptied into the external bins after the premises have closed to the public.

- All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is provided, except for access and egress or in case of an emergency.

# Protection of children from harm

- Children under 16 must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.

- A challenge 25 policy will be operated at the premises. There shall be sufficient public notices displayed at the premises advising customers of the policy in place.
