Detail

2. A number of issues have been introduced to the Committee's agenda as standing items. These include monitoring of the performance of the North East Ambulance Service, and consideration of the Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust Quality Account. The latter ensures that the Committee is able to consider the Account and Trust performance, with a view to providing a statement of assurance on behalf of the area.
3. A number of issues were identified during 2017-18 and in addition each constituent Council and the local NHS have been consulted on potential topics. Suggested topics are included at paragraph 6.
4. Members will be aware that in addition to the topics outlined in this report, issues may arise during the year that the Committee may need to be briefed on and/or respond to (for example, proposals for NHS service changes). Therefore the Committee will need to retain the element of flexibility in the work programme as has become standard practice.
5. The Committee is also advised to be aware of capacity constraints on Members and officers when ensuring the Committee has a focused and effective work programme.
