Tom Bryant advised Cabinet that TVCA has an aspiration for organisational excellence, but is aware that there is a long way to go and a lot of work to do.

He thanked Mayor Cooke and Erik Scollay for their help to date as Middlesbrough have already gone through this process

The Director of Operations advised that a dedicated team has been established to oversee the implementation of the plan and Change & Transformation have been engaged as an organisational development partner to provide support.

TVCA's statutory committees have been engaged and expressed a wish to continue to be involved.



TVCA progress will be overseen by the Independent Advisory Board, chaired by Rob Whiteman.

Members were given an opportunity to comment or ask questions.

Councillor Brown enquired how success will be measured and was advised that Government will look to the Independent Advisory Board and external auditor EY, for updates on how we are progressing on the improvement journey.

A report will be brought back to every Cabinet on progress to date and a further report will be provided by the Chair of the Independent Advisory Board.

Councillor Brown commented that the Best Value Notice has been positively responded to so far as he feels more integral to TVCA. He thanked Tom Bryant and the team at TVCA.

Councillor Harrison commented that a lot of progress has been made, and the organisation is moving in the right direction, working as a group now. The workshops were useful. She continued to say that she looks forward to further progress and to having an authority to be proud of.

Mayor Cooke enquired who is holding the actions as if they are not allocated, nobody can be held to account. He was advised that every action will have an owner and this will be embedded throughout the organisation so that there is clear accountability.

Mayor Cooke enquired about the transfers to and from reserves. He was advised that the majority is a result of slippage on capital schemes. The



Group Director of Finance & Resources advised Cabinet that ways of reporting back to members is currently being reviewed.

BUSINESS GROWTH - SERVICE DELIVERY PLAN

Cabinet were provided a report which set out the review of the current Business Growth service which has been undertaken prior to allocating the remaining 2025/26 UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) Supporting Local Business allocation. The package of business support delivered through UKSPF to date was a pilot designed to test alternative delivery models, which finished at the end of March 2025, so further performance and evaluation data is now available.

The report set out the review undertaken to date, the proposed Tees Valley model and made recommendations on the allocations of UKSPF in 2025/26, which support the transition to this new model.

Cabinet were recommended to:-
