Scrutiny Review – Partnership Working in Early Help			
Achieved since last meeting	The Committee received evidence in October from Catalyst regarding partnership working. It was felt that there was a strong reputation for collaboration in the Borough and the sector felt supported. A report outlining learning from visits to two Ofsted rated Outstanding Local Authorities, Lincolnshire and Sunderland, was presented at the meeting. Their Early Help delivery models prioritise shared responsibility, partnership working, and systemwide cultural change, with 80% of Early Help delivery in Lincolnshire being provided by external partners. The Committee also received a presentation on the Department for Education's Family First Partnership Programme reforms for Children's Social Care, which are designed to promote partnership working to ensure families receive the support and protection they need. Statutory interventions and protections will remain with and be provided by Local Authorities. An informal meeting was held in November to discuss the evidence and draft recommendations. During the review the Committee have received evidence from Council officers regarding the in house and school support Early Help offer, Family Action who have a strategic partnership with the Council to provide services, Harrogate and District Foundation Trust who are commissioned to provide 0 – 19 services, Cleveland Police who chair a triage and early intervention initiative 'PiTstop', Catalyst, and Stockton Parent Carers Forum. The Committee have also joined a Service Users Focus Group at Billingham Hub and the Children and Young People Partnership workshops.

	 Cost of Living Response - a briefing note provided an overview of key projects undertaken by the Fairer Stockton- on-Tees and Community Engagement team including school uniform distribution, which was the outstanding recommendation for the review. Around 700 items of school uniform have been collected by families July, and distributed via a variety of avenues including events, Thirteen Housing and Family Hubs.

	 Disabled Facilities Grant – two recommendations, to monitor the impact of the extra funding for DFG's and to produce a study on the impact of DFG's, were fully achieved while the remaining recommendations were ongoing. 	
	Referral forms, application forms and letters had been updated as recommended to simplify the process and improve communication.	
	The waiting list had significantly reduced from 300 when the review started in April 2024 to 120 at the time of the progress update. Subsequently, waiting times had also significantly reduced from 24- 30 months to 12-18 months.	
	Conversations with Thirteen had progressed with working arrangement proposed to ensure assessments and adaptations requests are forwarded direct to Thirteen to determine and carry out. If they are beyond Thirteens capacity the Council will carry out the adaptation and reclaim the costs.
