Incorporates a number of the recommendations made from the 2018 Government-commissioned review of the DFG


- Sets out best practice for the delivery of DFG

- Promotes timely delivery






Delta Data – indication of performance




What the Delta Data Indicates –Age Groups






Timescales in the Legislation






The 5 Stages of DFG – From the guidance

	Target timescales (working days)				
Туре	Stage 1	Stage 2	Stage 3	Stage 4	Total
Urgent & Simple	5	25	5	20	55
Non-urgent & Simple	20	50	20	40	130
Urgent & Complex	20	45	5	60	130
Non-urgent & Complex	35	55	20	80	180






What the Delta Data Indicates – Delivery Times

Delivery model - Maturity of DFG Delivery






National trends also impacting on delivery in Stockton

- Increasing demand Policy; Covid and impact on frailty; Children, and complexity
- The rising cost of materials
- Prioritising statutory duty over discretionary powers
- Relationships with Housing Associations
- Housing Revenue Accounts and Stock Transfer Agreements Funding has not mirrored
 DFG allocation from the Department of Level Up, Housing and Communities



Delivery and the DFG Process – the positives


- Strategic alignment (BCF and Council Strategic plan)
- Stockton provides an Agency Service (although separate HIA and DFG teams)
- 'Top-slice' approach customer benefits from being able to access the full DFG amount
- Number of DFGs going into private rented properties
- Number of Children DFGs
- Proactive housing options approach those waiting for DFG, there
 are discussions about a more suitable alternative housing option





Delivery and the DFG Process – areas for development

- Website information for residents
- Improving stage 2 Deeper dive is needed to see where improvements can be made
- Improving stage 4 Current challenges with the approach. Foundations can work with the team to look at options
- Current Housing Assistance Policy limited discretion, although the team have been considering other areas
- Priority system Check if it is equitable for all age groups
- Stockton is atypical in that HIA sits separately from the DFG team (will discuss shortly)
- Unintended consequences of changes on the level of demand

- Homeowner DFG Top-up loan
- Stairlift and Ramp Equipment
- Reviewing current HAP which Foundations can support with
